—— 2019-20 REGISTRATION NOW OPEN! ——

We have started our kindergarten registration for the 2019-2020 school year. Registration forms will be dated as submitted to assist with placement determination.

Please tell your neighbors and other Big Sky families about registering kindergarten children starting now.

To register for kindergarten, your child must be 5 years old by Sept. 10th. When you register, you need to bring in a birth certificate and current immunization record. You can register without the final shots, but we need proof of the shots before the child can attend school. The enrollment form can be picked up at the school or you may go on the Billings Public Schools website and print off a form, fill it out, and bring it into the school. The completed form, birth certificate, and proof of immunizations must be returned to the school before May 31st, as the school office is not open during the summer. Spring registrations allow us to prepare for adequate staffing. You will receive a letter in mid-August, telling who your child's teacher will be and providing more information about school.
