# **BURNING ISSUES**

- 1. It would be beneficial if Counselors had training in two sessions so that we have necessary staff on campus when issues arise.
  - The county has started scheduling morning and afternoon sessions for workshops but, monthly meetings are only beneficial if all support staff is present. There is a possibility that administration will become trained in suicide protocol so that they can step in if support staff is off campus.
- 2. The same 5 people seems to always have the computers reserved. It's been more challenging to reserve them. Especially if you aren't planned 4 weeks in advance.

### SOLUTION: Set a limit on the number of times per month signing up is allowed

- Please make sure you are reserving carts for planned lessons, not reserving carts and then planning what to do with them.
- 3. Can we PLEASE have the PTA or someone provide each classroom with X amount of tissues and Clorox wipes for the year? I'm spending a lot of \$\$ on them and I'd love to have especially them available especially during flu season. Parents occasionally send them in, but not nearly enough. Keeping up with receipts is just another thing to do.

  - More adult supervision (administration or the deputy) would be helpful.

- 5. Imbalance of workload among staff- what is the plan for next year in regard to teaching load? It is difficult to ignore the fact that there are people who do not teach every day and large classes throughout the building.
  - Mr. Smith has addressed this numerous times. These decisions were made to help accommodate our lack of teaching space.

brushing your teeth and taking a shower daily (just an example of one of the lessons). It is also hard to use the lessons as a framework to build on when we don't get them until a day or two before we have to teach it.

SOLUTION: Do something meaningful with the kids, like a service project or offer a study hall period or revise the lessons we have now to make them more engaging for the kids.
