

JIS IB Results

- 2018 - Highest score 43 points (3 students)
36% of JIS students achieve 40 points or more
94% exceed world Average IB Diploma Score.
- 2017 - Two students gained the maximum 45 points. Two of only 218 in the world.
- 2016 - Average JIS points score 37.3 compared to the world average of 30.1.
- 2014, 2015 and 2016 - Highest JIS student score was 43 points.
- 2013 - One student gained the maximum 45 points. One of only 108 in the world!
- Recent JIS IB Graduate Destinations:
Cambridge University, Imperial College London, Stanford University USA, University of California, Berkeley, USA, University of British Columbia Canada and Australia National University (ANU).

- Study of the Theory of Knowledge (TOK)
- Completion of an Extended Essay (EE)
- Participation in Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS)

IB Core Requirements

Theory of Knowledge

A course that encourages an appreciation of other cultures. Students will examine different ways of knowing (perception, emotion, language and reason) and the different kinds of knowledge (scientific, artistic, mathematical and historical).

Extended Essay

A 4,000 word independent research project through an in-depth study of a question relating to one of the subjects they are studying.

Creativity, Activity, Service

Real experiences beyond the classroom.

- Creativity – could include, for example, music, dance, art or photography.
- Activity – sports or expeditions and projects
- Service – an exchange that benefits both the student and community

How IB is Assessed

- Individual subjects are assessed on a scale of 1 to 7 (7 being the highest, 1 is the lowest)
- A maximum of 42 points can thus be achieved for the six subjects
- 3 points available from the core requirements
- Maximum score = 45 points
