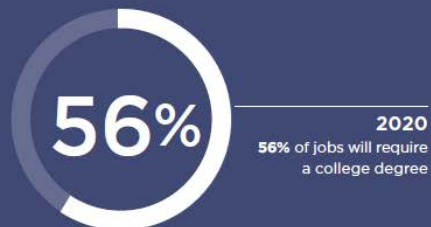
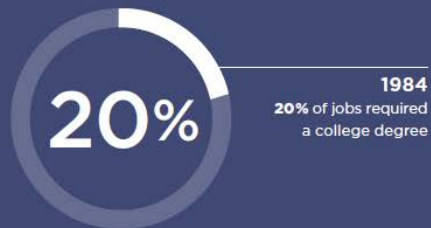

# College Counseling & Alumni Support

Robust and comprehensive college counseling is a central component of the YES Prep program. In fact, beginning in sixth grade, students and their families are exposed to colleges and universities across the country through annual trips, parent information sessions, and college counseling seminars. Our ratio of students to counselors is **40:1**, compared to the Texas average of **355:1**.



The College Initiatives Team exists to develop college-going identities and empower our students and families to fulfill the YES Prep mission and they do so by serving students through the following mindsets:



**Advising: We help students find the best fit.**

Every YES Prep student receives individualized counseling throughout the college selection and application process, including through the creation of personalized college affordability plans with parents.



**Alumni: We help students earn a degree by promoting full-time enrollment.**

In collaboration with campus leadership, our alumni support team works with students across the country to provide support and resources for their transition to and journey through college.



**Seminar: We help students develop their college-going identity by delivering high-quality instruction.**

YES Prep students take a college counseling seminar each year of high school. These classes teach students both academic and non-cognitive skills essential to building their future college identity.

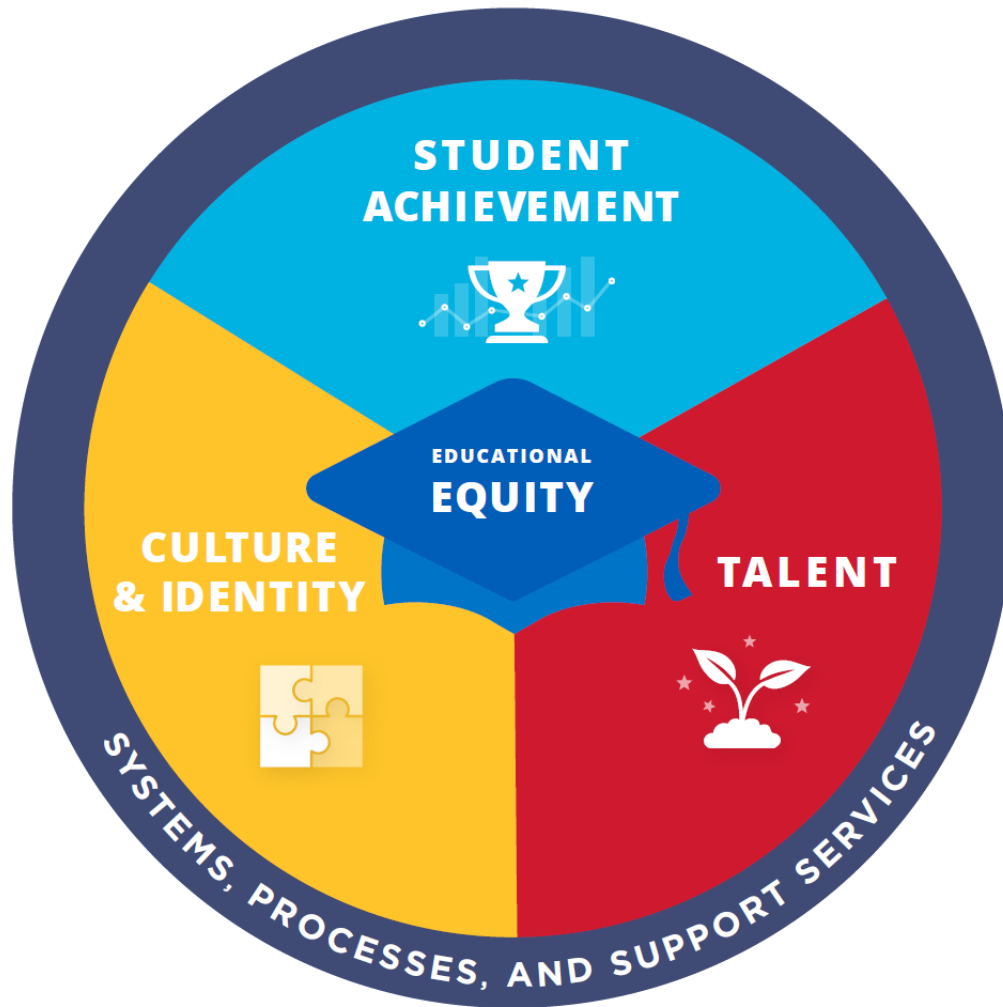


**Student Opportunities: We help students connect to communities and non-traditional learning opportunities.**

By the time a YES Prep student graduates from high school, he or she has visited more than 20 different college campuses across the country and will have engaged in at least one service, academic, or cultural enrichment opportunity outside of the classroom.

# Our Educational Model

YES Prep operates small, sixth- through twelfth-grade campuses that enable our teachers and school leaders to build transformative relationships with students who often enter our system one or more grade levels behind. From day one, YES Prep students are held to higher academic standards than their peers in most traditional independent school districts. With state standards as the floor – not the ceiling – our curriculum is designed to prepare students for rigorous Advanced Placement (AP) level coursework in high school and ensure they are college-ready. Additionally, YES Prep students are involved in a wide array of enrichment opportunities, such as annual college trips, which expose them to top colleges and universities throughout the country.

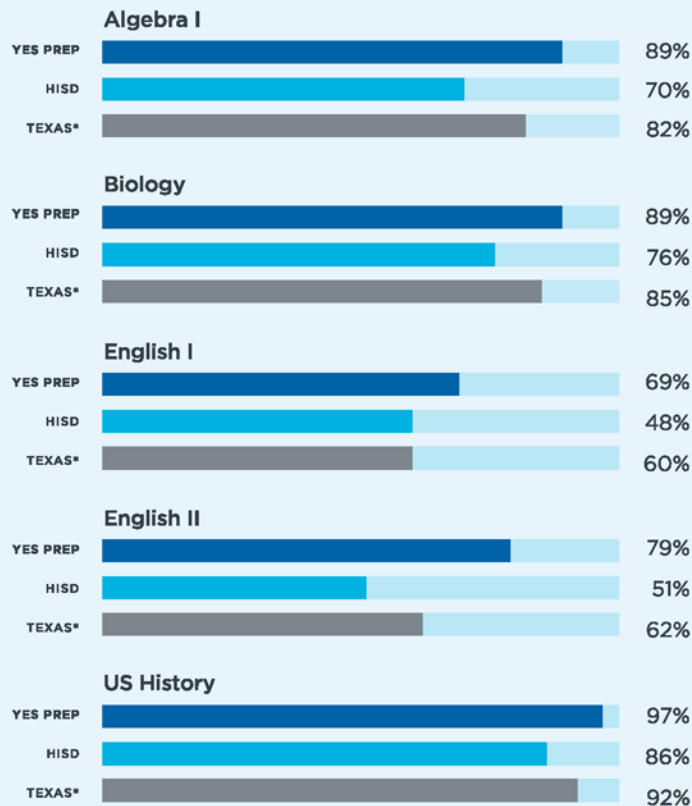

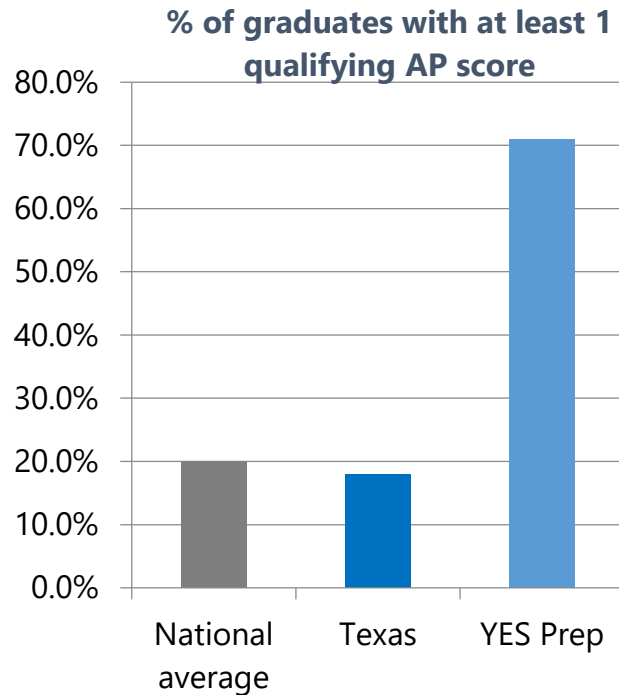

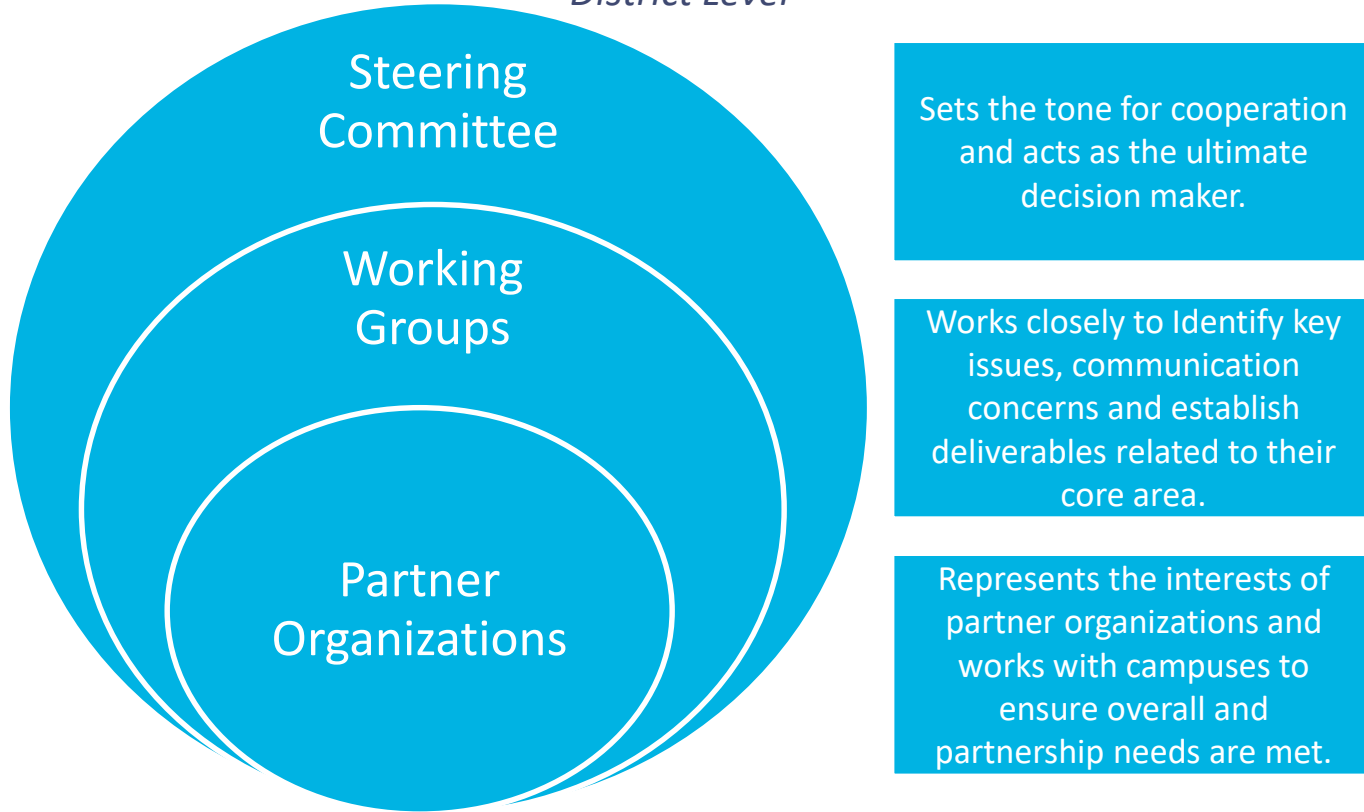
## Aldine ISD

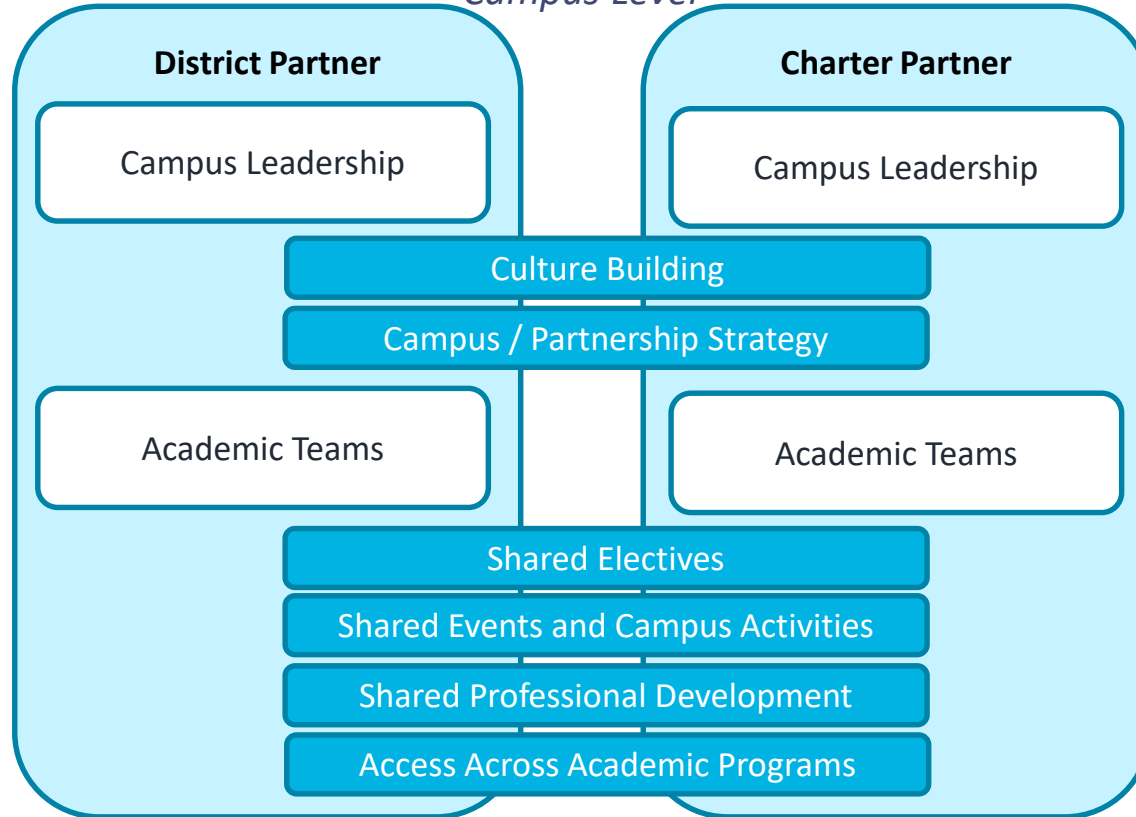
# Current Partnership Mechanics

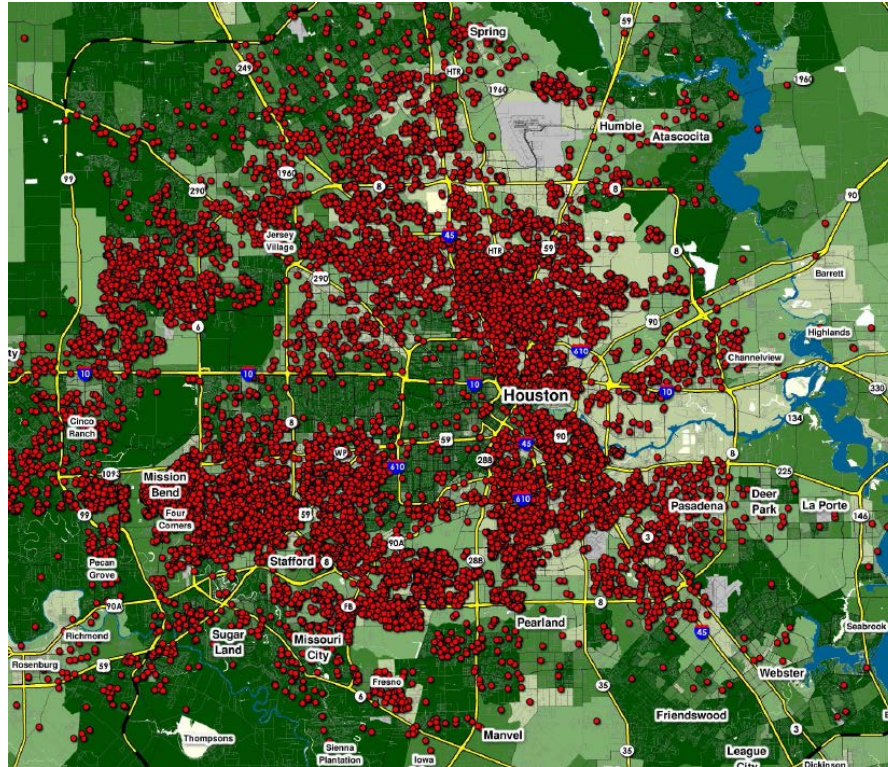

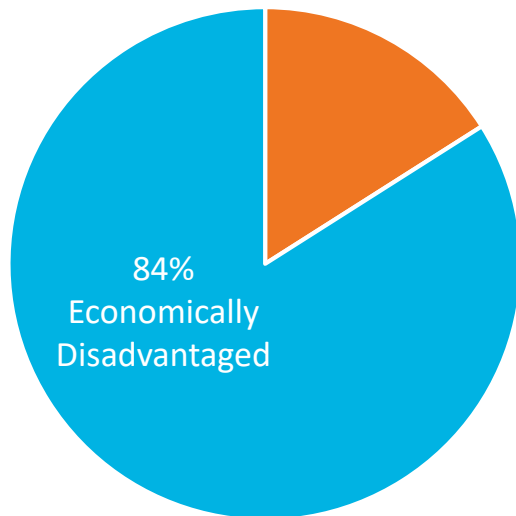

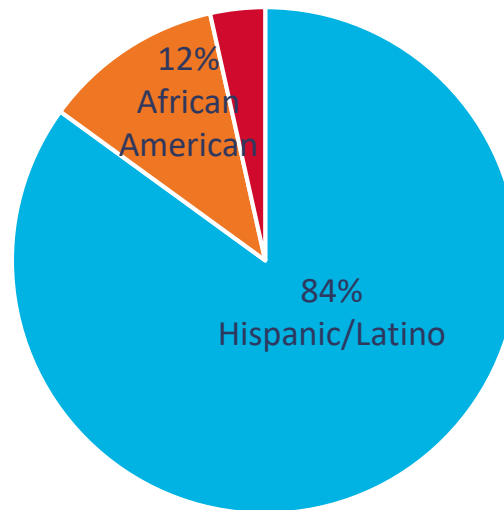

*Phil started at YES Prep in 2004 as a Middle School Language Arts teacher at the Southeast campus. After two years teaching at YES Prep he moved into campus leadership as the Principal of the North Central campus. In this position he managed student culture and served on the campus leadership team. In 2009, Phil returned to the Southeast campus to serve as School Director. He directed a turnaround initiative at the first and largest YES Prep campus, which resulted in notably improved teacher satisfaction and the campus's highest scores in standardized tests and AP exams. In 2012, he became Associate Head of Schools for YES Prep, during which he provided leadership coaching for school directors while leading the Southeast campus. He was also appointed to the Human Capital Board Committee to analyze talent data and initiatives with YES Prep Board members. Phil became Head of Schools in 2013, managing school directors at six YES Prep campuses, including all four partnership schools with SBISD and AISD, along with the Student Support department in the Home Office.
