The teacher must have a strong educational background and teaching experience in math, in addition to an ability to understand and model the importance of involvement in the community. US teachers are expected to engage in ongoing professional development, authentic collaboration with other faculty and staff, and to understand inquiry-based pedagogy. Other full-time faculty responsibilities include being an adviser and occasional chaperoning duties. The successful candidate will have experience and confidence in using technology for classroom organization and curricular enhancement, a demonstrated history of innovative pedagogies and collegial engagement with professional peers, and will possess the ability to support the OES educational mission.
