Parental Involvement Policy

A positive, productive interaction between the home, the school and the community is imperative for the continued success of the school-wide program at Stephensville Elementary. The Stephensville Elementary staff through the Title I Parental Involvement Program is dedicated to offering parents a variety of opportunities to know their school, the Title I Program, the staff at Stephensville Elementary and opportunities to get involved in their child's school.

The staff at Stephensville Elementary is committed to working with families in a parental involvement program that:

- 1. Recognizes that all parents are a significant force in their child's education
- 2. Keeps parents informed about what is happening in the Title I school-wide program
- 3. Offers to parents a variety of parent programs, workshops, and resource materials
- 4. Maintains an open door policy to parents while maintaining uninterrupted instructional time
- 5. Keeps parents informed pertaining to school and student accountability and overall school and student performance

Objectives:

- 1. To keep the parents of students informed about the services provided to students and their families
- 2. To encourage greater active participation by parents in their child's education
- 3. To continue to improve the services provided by the Title I school-wide program as a result of frequent communication and input from parents
- 4. To keep parents informed pertaining to notification when a student has been assigned, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks, by a teacher who is not highly qualified
- 5. To convene an annual meeting, at a time convenient for parents to inform them of their school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in those programs. In order to keep parents informed, schools must offer a flexible number of additional parental involvement meetings, such as in the morning or evening so that as many parents as possible are able to attend.
- 6. During the annual school meeting, parents will be made aware of all curricular programs, assessments and supporting services available to students.

Activities:

- 1. Conduct an annual Open House for all parents
- 2. Conduct two annual parent-teacher conference days in which parents can meet with their child's teacher to discuss student progress
- 3. The school, will conduct school based parent meetings and workshops addressing the needs identified by parents and/or school personnel
- 4. The Stephensville Elementary School Handbook will be prepared and made available to all parents of students enrolled in the school.
- 5. Conduct a minimum of four school-wide parental involvement meetings per year
- 6. Pre-K will conduct at least two parental involvement meetings per year
- 7. Parental input will be solicited regarding the types of workshops or inservices needed
- 8. Encourage parent participation in scheduled parent/teacher conferences
- 9. Continually search for effective, innovative methods of promoting, encouraging, and improving parental involvement activities
