Lisa Wood welcomed Community Council. Motion to approve January Minutes by Amy Gray, seconded by Malia Roundy, Approval was unanimous including Stacy Barney, Jim Wright, Malia Roundy, Kate Niederhauser, Kent Brown, Amy Gray, Lisa Wood, Jenni Coyle.

Counseling Reports that registration for 2019-2020 is underway and nearing completion.

Teachers Report (JSSC) that end of term is near, Parent Teacher Conference in classrooms provided an atmosphere for teachers and parent to discuss things that they would not in a cafeteria style conference. Teachers generally liked this type on conference. Teachers are gearing up to “push to the end,” hoping to keep students and teachers motivated.

Student Reports that Spirit week is underway, wrestling season is finishing up, and Student Government Elections are about to begin. Council members discussed elected officials and appointed officers. Very few students ran for elected office which is a concern to the Council. Generally, it was felt students did not want to put themselves out there in front of their peers. It was noted that that is part of the Student Government Job and should be a necessary part of the student government election process. Student Government advisors will address the Student Government Elections for future procedures.

2018-2019 Monthly Budget Accounting Principal Hansen reports that Trust Lands allocations are in order according to the proposed spreadsheet.

19-20 Final Goal Review Community Council Chairperson reviewed goals which included,

1. Language Arts – We will increase our relative language Arts Growth Comparison ranking from 19th to 16th as measured by RISE growth of 40% at the end of the 2020 School Year.
2. Science – We will increase our relative Science Growth Comparison ranking from 17th to 13th as measured by RISE grow of 48% at the end of the 2020 School Year.
3. ACT – We will increase our ACT Composite MGP on the ACT Practice Test to 18.5 from 18.1
4. Credit Recovery – We will decrease the percentage of deficient credit students from 11% to 8% as they leave Kaysville Junior High to go to High School.

Lisa Wood made a motion to approve the Final Goals, seconded by Amy Gray, Voting for SIP Goals was unanimous including, Stacy Barney, Jim Wright, Malia Roundy, Kate Niederhauser, Kent Brown, Amy Gray, Lisa Wood, Jenni Coyle.

It was noted that generally the results of the ACT test, taken by the 9th grade students, were positive and students scores were above expectation. Conditions such as crowded testing space, talking, mental fatigue toward the end of testing will be addressed as student take this test in the future. ACT is a familiar platform for parents, students and faculty. ACT testing gives an additional metric to the RISE test results when measuring student achievement.
