- **FREE COLLEGE COURSES!!!**
- Students gain an early start on achieving an college credit.
- Dual Enrollment students are considered SCC students and are allowed to access services provided by SCC.
- Students can complete certain associate degree and career education certificates while still in high school.
- Tuition and fees are waived for dual enrolled students registered as a part-time student if the course is located on a high school campus.
- Depending on the class and the grade achieved, students may be able to transfer units to four-year institutions.

Instruction includes preparation for visual/gestural communication followed by intensive work on comprehension through receptive language skills, development of basic conversational skills, modeling of grammatical structures, and general information about American Deaf culture.
