We are pleased to present our second newsletter this term and hope you find them informative and helpful.

As well as information updates we intend giving each newsletter a theme so that we can inform you about aspects of the school. This one is all about our rewards system as, in consultation with Year Councils and ideas from tutors, we have recently reviewed the range and frequency of the rewards we offer.

Rewards are an integral part of school life and a very important way of recognising students' effort, contribution, achievement and improvement. It is important to note that we recognise positive attitudes, particularly those who are striving to 'turn a corner', as well as academic standards and progress. Consequently we look forward to many successful students receiving these in due course. The additions and changes we have made to the Achievements Points Reward Ladder can be seen on the attached page.

You will see in **R3** the introduction of a Tutee of the Week reward; tutors will select a tutee each week who has stood out because of his/her good attitude, achieving a particular target or for making a positive change and



s/he will be awarded with a Dining Hall Pass for the day which will enable them to go to the front of the queue - a greatly coveted reward!

In **R6**, following students' request, the reward for the tutor group with the highest achievement points for the term has been altered from popcorn and a film to pizza and a film, and in R4, the weekly attendance trophy will also be accompanied with sweets for the tutor group. The biggest changes come in **R7**; the celebration assemblies will now be held monthly and will have the new addition of the Good Citizen Award. Every

member of staff will be given a set number of golden tickets to be given out each day in recognition of students' manners, positive



behaviour and good deeds during tutorial time, clubs and unstructured time (corridors, dining hall and playground.)

The golden tickets will be collected in a tombola box and, every month, winning tickets will be selected for prizes. Currently, the Year Councillors are consulting with their tutor groups to get ideas about the types of prizes the students would like to be given and this will inform the final decisions.



For the **R9 end of year celebration** event for the two tutor groups with the highest number of

achievement points, it has been agreed that, at the end of the summer term, they will go on a subsidised trip to Thorpe Park; we are sure that this will prove to be very popular indeed. What an exciting year of rewards we have ahead of us!
