Thank you so much to our parent and staff association who raised the money for our fabulous new table tennis equipment- already much in demand!



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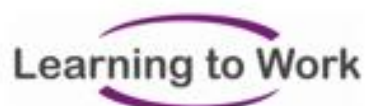
MOSAIC ENTERPRISE CHALLENGE



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On the 16th of January 2019, all Year 10 students at LHEA were taken off their normal lesson time table to take part in "MOSAIC ENTERPRISE CHALLENGE". The enterprise challenge was put together by Learning to work and the Princes Trust but delivered by local businesses to our students at the school.



The day was used as a great opportunity to bring together students, local employers and advisers through businesses and activities.

Students were put into groups of 4-5 members, encouraged to pick a catchy business name and allowed to invest commodities and see how much profit they could make from choices made within the team. Students got excited as they invested a few thousand pounds but were able to make £1.1 million in profit. They have also been encouraged to continue playing the simulation game. The students had a great day and had the opportunity to develop their communication, leadership, team playing and analytical skills.

90 yr.7's visited Cadbury World on Tuesday 11th December 2018. Students interest in Design and Technology was enhanced during this worthwhile study visit to Cadbury World.

Amongst other activities, Students learnt how the design of Chocolate and its packaging have evolved and discovered how Cadbury's and the Bourneville factory were developed over the years. Students also watched a demonstration before modelling and tempering chocolate and also wrote their name with it.

They were able to witness how advertising has evolved over the years, discussed the beautiful architecture and health and safety put in place for workers in the factory.

Students departed the Academy at 8.15am by coach to Cadbury World and returned to school at approximately 4:30pm.

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STEM

Science - Technology - Engineering - Math

Setting the stage

On 18/12/18, LHEA students in Yr. 7 had a Science Technology Engineering and Maths morning. The two hours consisted of teaching 156 students in groups of 5 mini episodes followed by short tasks. Students competed in teams and won prizes for achieving success.



The theme of the day was "Shapes and Patterns", in Maths they learnt about complex shapes and "Platonic Solids" calculating their angles. In Science, they learnt about the materials and chemicals put together to make paper and card and also had to draw a projection of growth for the material.
