Reminder Regarding the ID Cards and Lunch Accounts

May 20th is the last day lunch is being served. We will be charging FACTS accounts for all outstanding balances after that date. Please check your daughter's lunch balances through MyKidsSpending to avoid the balance being charged through FACTS. Next year, outstanding lunch account balance will be billed monthly to FACTS.

As a reminder, all students should wear their ID cards on a visible lanyard. Students must swipe into the building every day. This swipe card is also their means of payment in the Student Dining Room. Beginning next school year, students will need their swipe cards to make payment in the Student Dining Room – the pin number will not work.

This will help lines move more quickly and avoid mis-keyed pin entry. If your daughter needs a replacement ID, she should report to the Attendance/Security office immediately.

Middle States

Nazareth Academy High School, the only private Catholic high school for girls in Philadelphia, is pleased to report its achievement in earning the coveted reaccreditation status by the Middle States Association Commissions on Elementary and Secondary Schools, the gold standard for measuring and advancing school improvement. Middle States (cont.)

Middle States reaccreditation is a multifaceted evaluation process that schools and school systems voluntarily use to demonstrate they are meeting a defined set of research-based performance standards. The 12 Middle States Standards for Reaccreditation are: mission; governance and leadership; school improvement planning; finances; facilities; school organization and staff; health and safety; educational program; assessment and evidence of student learning; student services; student life and activities, and information resources.

The reaccreditation process begins with a self-study that is conducted by the school or school system and requires input from school leaders, teachers, parents and students. Following the self-study, a team of volunteer educators from Middle States member schools conducts an on-site peer review visit to observe school operations and interview various stakeholders.

Expansion of Academic Enrichment Program

For many years, Sister Teresa Mary Lukaszewski, CSFN, has been providing valuable academic enrichment at Nazareth for students who have learning needs in the learning support program. Without the work by Sister Teresa Mary, the needs of students at Nazareth Academy with learning differences would not have been met.

While Sister Teresa Mary does an excellent job with learning support, the reality is that there is only one of her so the program needed expansion to ensure that the needs of our students were fully addressed. The expansion of the program adds a teacher who specializes in Reading with a Special Education certification.

We are pleased to announce that Ms. Moira Whalen, a 2009 Nazareth alumna, will join our faculty this fall and work with Sister Teresa Mary. Ms. Whalen earned her undergraduate and graduate degrees from Saint Joseph's University after her graduation from Nazareth.

In addition to her teaching experience at St. Albert the Great School and Ancillae-Assumpta Academy, Ms. Whalen is certified in Special Education K-12 and as a Reading Specialist K-12. Ms. Whalen will teach students Reading and Learning Strategies, while Sister Teresa Mary will teach Math and Learning Strategies.

The students in the program will go to learning support for an entire block every day, and will split the block between Reading and Math. This team approach for the students, with parents, academic enrichment teachers, administration, and classroom teachers all involved is designed to help our students succeed in every way possible.

Internet Upgrade

Through last month, the internet service to Nazareth Academy High School was provided in partnership with the system at Holy Family University. While this agreement with Holy Family was beneficial because it gave our teachers and students much needed internet access, it was apparent that we needed both more speed and capacity to meet the level of quality of teaching and learning here at Nazareth Academy High School.

We are pleased to announce an upgrade of our internet speed and capacity at Nazareth. After nearly two years of upgrades to the backend of the systems structure, the WIFI network was reconfigured and segmented into separate accounts for students, faculty, and guests. Last month, we finalized two separate, 1Gbps high-speed connections from both Comcast and Verizon. These upgrades have increased our internet speed and capacity to meet the demands of the 21st Century learner with more enhancements to follow.
