# Late Student Pick-up

**Parents, please note:** In order to comply with state licensing requirements, a new procedure for students not picked up immediately after dismissal has been implemented.

Costello Students are dismissed at 4:07. Parents should be at Costello no later than 4:10 to get their students. Students not picked-up by 4:20 will be designated as "Late Pick-up" and sent to CARE (located in the cafeteria).

Effective immediately: Parents will be charged \$60 for the supervision of children not picked up by 4:20 and will have to complete a "Late Pickup" form. This process is being implemented to insure that after/before school CARE is in compliance.



# 2019/2020 TEACHER PLACEMENT

*Parents, please do not request a specific teacher for your student(s) for the next school year.* The following procedure is used to appropriately place students:

1. Current teachers complete a student profile form for each student in his/her class. The profile sheet allows teachers to identify each individual student's strengths and needs.

2. The class lists will be constructed so that each class is relatively balanced with regard to gender, ethnicity, academic abilities, and social-emotional developmental levels.

3. A team consisting of pertinent staff will meet a second time prior to class lists being finalized. The team will review the class lists and make any necessary adjustments to reflect any changes that take place during the summer.

4. Requests for a specific teacher cannot be considered; however, parents may send a letter to the principal describing information regarding their child's learning style. Letters should be submitted to Dr. DiPonio on or before June 9th.

5. Parents will be informed of their teacher assignments via e-mail just prior to Tuesday, August 27<sup>th</sup> (the first day of school).

Thank you for respecting this process. Time-tested, this process has proven to be effective in ensuring that students are placed in a classroom that will allow her/him the best opportunity to have a successful school year.
