You are here. Make an impact. Reflections on a theme.

Since September, the Junior School has been exploring the yearly theme, "You are here. Make an impact" by considering the question "What gifts live within my impact on myself, others, and my community?" Each month, one of our Wednesday assemblies focussed on this theme. In September, the theme was introduced and students were invited to think about impact as a gift that we can give and receive.

In October, we explored how we could give the gift of impact by being *inquiring communicators*. We read a beautiful picture book called, *Rabbit Listened*, by Cori Doerrfeld that inspired us to consider what could happen if we just took the time to listen. In November, we examined what it means to be a *reflective thinker* as we considered the importance of self-awareness as a way of having impact on ourselves and others. We examined a character infographic that challenged us to consider how our thoughts become words, that become actions, that become habits, that become our character, that shapes our destiny. In December, we considered what it means to be *open-minded* by considering our shared experiences and hopes as humans with a reading of the story, *I am Human: A Book of Empathy*, by Susan Verde.

In January, we inquired into what it means to be *courageously principled* as we explored what gifts we could give ourselves and each other if we actually practiced the "Golden Rule" (treat others the way you want to be treated) every day. Even though we often say, "practice the Golden Rule" it became clear that students had not truly internalized what it means to consider, *'would I like it if this was done/happened to me?*' as a way to consider the impact of their choices. We watched a video that inspired three of our Grade 2 students to courageously lead us in creating rainbows of kindness to show each other action we can take to practice the "Golden Rule" that extended through the month of February. These rainbows remain on bulletin boards throughout the school. In March, we considered what it means to have a *balanced* and *open mind* as we watched a beautiful animated short film called *The Potter* that depicted how having a growth mindset can help us overcome challenges, setbacks, and frustrations. And finally, in May we explored how being *knowledgeable and reflective thinkers* can help our brains to grow new neural pathways by firing up our dendrites to consolidate a school year's worth of social, emotional, and cognitive growth.

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As we round out the year, I am so proud of how our students embraced this theme as they made an impact on themselves, each other, and our wider community. By being here and making an impact, our students have brought our four pillars (academics, service, athletics, and arts) to life. Every child has so much learning to be proud of. Students showed perseverance, determination, open-mindedness, and balance on their quests to become critical and creative thinkers. Design Day was a highlight for me - students across all grades worked together to explore the design prompt, "how might we enhance cooperation, creativity, and collaboration in our play spaces?" Our Grade 6 and 7 students embraced the opportunity to be design leaders with younger students as they imagined, empathized, planned, and prototyped. I was amazed by the creativity, innovation, and ingenuity that emerged from the designs and have made some notes of common elements that stood out for future possibilities in our play spaces.

Our Grade 7 *Making a Difference Fair* was a wonderful way to celebrate how knowledge can lead to thoughtful action and service when we are open to having an impact on ourselves and our wider community. Our busy PYP sandwich makers prepared hundreds of sandwiches over the year to impact hunger in our local community. Our SLAT (Students Leading Action Together) team led several initiatives, such as a winter clothing drive and a plastic bag collection drive to help keep plastics out of the oceans and support a local charity that makes sleeping mats for homeless members of our community.

Our athletics teams experienced the power of impact as they worked together to develop their sport-specific skills and sportsmanship. A highlight was receiving an email from a principal from another ISABC school who wrote to tell me how polite and respectful our students were while attending a Play Day at their school. Several teams had strong finishes to their seasons. Highlights include, gold for the Grade 7 Boys soccer (Div. 2), a 2nd place finish in the regular seasons for the Grade 7 Girls volleyball team, silver for the Grade 7A boys basketball team (Div. 1), bronze for the Grade 7 Girls basketball team (Div. 1), a 3rd place overall finish for the Grade 3-7 Track and Field Team at the ISEA meet, and bronze for our Coed Ultimate A Team. Congratulations to all of our athletes who represented our school and developed their commitment to being part of a team!

The MYP production of the musical Mary Poppins Jr. had a huge impact on our community by bringing us the joy of song, theatre, and dance as our talented musicians and artists brought Cherry Tree Lane to life. The commitment and enthusiasm of all of our Grades 5-7 students in staging this production was nothing short of outstanding - I am still singing Supercalifragilisticexpialidocious!

Thank you Junior School for embracing our yearly theme - you are here and you made an impact! Volet!

Class Placements for 2019-20

The Junior School faculty is committed to creating class groupings that consider each child's emotional, academic, and social needs within the wider grade-level context. There is a considerable amount of deliberation and care inherent in our class placement process:

- Current homeroom teachers create the initial lists in June, assigning students to Class A or Class B
- Specialist teachers and Vice-Principals review the lists and make further recommendations
- Completed lists are submitted to the Junior School Principal for final review and assignment of Homeroom teachers for September.

While we strive to ensure that each child has at least one close friend in their class, there are only two class options to choose from, which can sometimes pose challenges when creating groupings that balance the needs and dynamics of all children in the cohort. Given the sensitivity and confidentiality that must be adhered to when determining best-fit class placements, it is our policy not to entertain parental requests for certain teachers or peer groupings as we cannot guarantee that these types of requests can be honoured. Please do not make requests to your child's current teachers about class placement for the following school year. If there are specific concerns that you wish the School to be aware of, they should be addressed in advance of the end of the current school year with the Junior School Principal. Final class lists are made available electronically on the Friday before Labour Day.

We thank you in advance for your trust and confidence in our faculty as we consider a wide variety of needs in determining class placements.

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Senior School Drama and Theatre Final Update

As the year winds swiftly to a close, I wanted to take this opportunity to thank all the parent volunteers who have helped out in drama and have supported their teen in a multitude of ways. Term 3 has seen the usual flurry of activity in the drama department, with our One Act Play Festival, an Improv Field Trip, and the upcoming grade 9 performance of local playwright Dennis Foon's *SKIN*, on June 4th.

We held our One Act Play Festival earlier in May and, by adjudication, the two plays selected to move on to the VISTA Festival at St. Georges were "All in Your Own Time" written by Southridge graduate **Molly Maguire** and directed by **Mireille Perez**, and "Mr. Winkler's Birthday Party" directed by **Savannah Rawlins** and **Rachel Stephens**. These shows performed at the VISTA festival last Friday night, and were both well received by the adjudicator. **Molly Maguire** ended up taking home the award for Best Student Written Play (they ignored the fact that she graduated last year), and **Jaedyn Nuraney** and **Brian Rickard** got the adjudicator's honorable mention for Stage Management and Tech.

Meanwhile, the Improv Club enjoyed a night out at Vancouver Theatre Sports and we laughed the night away! We also picked up lots of ideas for Improv exercises for the club next year. The grade 10 class is finishing up their practice run with One Acts by performing staged readings, and the grade 9 class, led by teacher Mr. Neil, is in the final stages of rehearsal for their class play, taking place on June 4th.
