Criteria for Selection

- "Cardinal Gibbons Athletic Hall Of Fame" was formed for the purpose of recognizing and honoring those student- athletes, coaches, teams, administrators and special individuals who have made an outstanding contribution and/or offered extraordinary service to Cardinal Gibbons Athletics. The following criteria are considered when making inductee selections.
- 1. Nominations are based on the following categories: athlete, coach, team, administrator, or special individuals.
- 2. Athletes must have graduated 10 years before an individual or team can be considered.
- 3. An athlete must have lettered in at least one varsity sport.
- 4. An individual (if not selected posthumously) must be present to accept the award, unless unforeseen circumstances prevent him/her from attending. Without these unforeseen circumstances a nominee has only 3 years to be present to be inducted.
- 5. If there is a tie in the nominations the earlier graduate will be chosen.
- 6. An individual maybe nominated for more than one category at one time and may be inducted as an individual and team in the same or different classes.
- 7. An equal number of male and female athletes are strongly suggested.
- 8. Recommendation forms and nominee information must meet all deadlines to be eligible for consideration.
- 9. Anyone in the Hall of Fame may nominate a person or team who the individual feels is worthy and meets the above criteria. However, if you are not a Hall of Fame member, you must do so through a current Hall of Fame member. It will be the Cardinal Gibbons Hall of Fame member's responsibility to fill out the nomination form, thereby verifying, endorsing the credentials, qualifications and character of this nominee. All nominations must be presented to the Board with facts to back up the reasons why this person should be a member of the Hall of Fame. All information on eligible candidates will be presented to the Board. The Board, in turn by vote, will choose the candidates for the respective year.
- 10. The Hall of Fame Committee consists of the Selection Committee Members and all inducted members.

Gene went to Hackley School in Tarrytown, NY where he played Varsity Football 2 years, Varsity Basketball 3 years and Varsity Baseball 3 years. He was Captain of Basketball and Baseball and Athlete of the Year his Senior year.

He graduated from Hackley School 1960 and went on to play for Babson College in Wellesley Massachusetts in 1961. There he scored 23 points for them at the Boston Garden. After he went to Oklahoma City University where he played baseball. Gene also played in the 1965 NCAA Basketball tournament.

After graduating Gene went on to teach Math and coached 8th grade Basketball from Sept 1966 to June 1969. He also coached Golf at Hackley From 1968 and 1969 with a (24 - 1 - 1) and 24 wins in a row.

In 1967 he married his wonderful wife, Jean Vander Schaaf. In 1969 Gene taught Math and Coached Varsity Basketball at Pine Crest in Ft. Lauderdale. Also, in the same year they welcomed their first bundle of joy, Stephanie Jean Morrison Born Nov. 8, 1969. Stephanie went on to graduated from CGHS in 1987. Continuing his career, Gene taught Math at the Mills School in Ft. Lauderdale 1970 - 73 and started the Boys Basketball team 1971, 1972 and 1973. During his tenure there Gene and

Jean welcomed their second daughterJennifer Jean Morrison Born on Nov. 24, 1971. and she also graduated from CGHS in 1990. In 1976 Gene started at Cardinal Gibbons teaching Geometry and coaching Golf. In just a year he went to state with Tom Garner in May 1977. The golf team won Districts in 1983, 1984, 1995, 1998 and 1999. In 1980 and 1984 the Golf Team Came in second. In 1980 and 1984 Gene was named Boys Coach of the Year. Gene started the Cardinal Gibbons Invitational in 1984 and the Benjamin Invitation which continues to this day.

Gene also coached the Girls Basketball at Cardinal Gibbons 1982 through 1986. He received an All Broward County Basketball Award Certificate for Girls Basketball 1984 for outstanding Achievement.

In 1986 he started Girls Golf team at Cardinal Gibbons and went to state with Mary Dunne. Gene was named Girls Coach of the Year 1989. Gene served on the State Advisory Board 1998 and 1999.

In 1993 Gene retired from from Cardinal Gibbons. Gene was honored by St. Thomas Athletic Booster Club Hall of Fame Oct. 1994. Gene and Jean now resides in Nesbit, Mississippi and they love attending the Memphis Grizzly Basketball Games.







Ellen Dunne '96



Ellen Dunne's golf career began at the age of six by watching and following her older sister Mary Dunne-Hembd, '89, a member of the Cardinal Gibbons Hall of Fame. After watching her sister play in golf tournaments and going to her golf lessons, she became runner- up twice in the Florida State Individual Championship.

During the course of her high school career, Ellen was the Miami Herald and Sun-Sentinel Player of the Year three out of the four years while at Cardinal Gibbons. She averaged 38 strokes per nine holes during her high school years. In her freshman year she came in second in her District and finished twice as a runner- up in the State Individual Championship her junior and senior year by two strokes both times.

She received a golf scholarship to Florida International University where she was a three time member of the Sun-belt conference and received the Lois P. Britton Women's Golf scholarship for and outstanding student-athlete with a GPA of 3.0 or better. Ellen graduated with a degree in Parks and Recreation with a minor in Sports Management.

Soon after graduating Ellen turned pro after winning the 2002 Broward Amateur. She competed on the Symetra Tour (the development tour for

the LGPA). She spent about five years traveling throughout the country on the tour and was also a member of the Sun Coast tour in Florida. In 2010 Ellen was one of the top five on the money list on the Sun Coast tour.

After playing on the tour for several years she has turned her love of the game of golf to LPGA Teaching and Club Profession. She is in her second level of apprentice in order to become a LPGA Teacher.

She is currently living in her home town of Lauderdale By The Sea and has been working for the golf retail store of Edwin Watts.

Michael started at Cardinal Gibbons in 1996 as a freshman. He played football, basketball, and volleyball his first two years, then chose to focus only on volleyball his junior and senior years. He was chosen by the Sun Sentinel and Miami Herald as 1st team all-county his sophomore, junior, and senior years. His senior year he was also named Player of the Year. In 1998, his junior year, he led the Redskins to the county championship over rival St Thomas. In 1999, his senior year, he led them to the Tri County Championship which is the equivalent to the state championship as volleyball was not a recognized sport by the state at that time. Also in 1999, he was named to the USA Junior Olympic Beach Volleyball Team.

Michael was offered numerous division 1 scholarships and eventually picked Lindenwood University in St. Charles, Mo. His freshman year he led the team in kills and was named 1st team All-Conference and 1st team All American. In 2002, his Junior year, he led the Lions to a runner up National Championship finish and was named All American.

After college Michael moved back to Pompano Beach, Fl and started playing professional 2-man beach volleyball. In 2003 he won his 1st of five Bud Light Beach Volleyball National Championships. He has won over 200 Open level tournaments

including over 20 Toyota Beach Volleyball Tour wins and most recently in 2016 won the National Volleyball League's East Coast Championships. In 2010, he got to as career-high as the 8th best team in the country before tearing his ACL and MCL. That pretty much put an end to his professional career and he focused on starting a family.

Michael met his wife Katie while in college and they have been married for ten years. They have two sons, Dominik and Dax and both the boys have a love for sports and are following in their dads' footsteps. Currently Michael is employed as a poker dealer at the Isle Casino in Pompano Beach.

Blair Walsh '08



Blair Walsh attended Cardinal Gibbons from 2005 through 2008. Blair excelled as a student-athlete during these years and was a key player on longtime great Gibbons Football Coach Michael Morrill's teams. During his time at Cardinal Gibbons Blair was named to the USA Today All American Team and was selected to play in the US Army All-American Game. He converted on a school record two 59 yard field goals during his time at Gibbons. With the help of his teammates, coaches, and family, Blair earned a football scholarship to play at the University of Georgia. While at Cardinal Gibbons, Blair developed what has become a long running desire to give back. He was proud to lead the Hospice by the Sea Teen volunteer program as its president.

In 2008 Blair made his debut for the #1 ranked Georgia Bulldogs. Later that year was named to the freshman All-SEC team. In 2009 Blair was tabbed as one of three finalists for the Lou Groza Award (given to the nation's top place kicker) and was also named the CFPA Placekicker of the Year. After the 2010 season, Blair was named to the All-SEC first team and was voted to the UGA's Football Team of the Decade (2000-10). During his senior year, he became the All-Time leading scorer in SEC history with 412 points and helped his team secure an SEC East championship.

While playing for the Dawgs Blair became deeply involved in charitable pursuits in the greater Atlanta area including multiple visits to the Shepherds.

In the spring of 2012, Blair was drafted in the 6th round of the NFL Draft by the Minnesota Vikings. Following his first season with the Vikings, Blair was named a first Team All-Pro and selected to the Pro Bowl. During this season he set multiple NFL and franchise records, including the most 50+ yard field goals in an NFL season (10). He also owns the NFL record for the most consecutive 50+ yard field goals in NFL history (12). Blair also holds the Vikings franchise record for longest field goal (56). Blair twice led the league in Field Goals Made in 2015 and 2012.

While playing in the NFL Blair continued following his passion for charitable work. He spent much of his time and treasures doing weekly visits to the Children's Hospitals and Ronald McDonald's houses in Minneapolis and Seattle. Some of the many things Blair did included

visiting families staying in the Ronald McDonald going through bereavement, visiting with children battling illness in the children's hospital, providing tickets and game day passes to families in the Ronald McDonald House, appearing/acting in "in-house" entertainment productions for children at the children's hospital.

Blair has been fortunate to have a healthy and happy start to his career. Blair's experiences at Cardinal Gibbons were instrumental in laying the foundation for what will be many more successful years ahead.



By his own admission, his skills and talents in athletics would not qualify him for admission into the Hall of Fame unless there was an award given to the athlete who broke the school record for accumulated minutes on the bench! Nevertheless, the lessons learned about the value and importance of being a member of a sports team were not lost on this young man.

Paul D. Ott '66 was the second of five Ott siblings to attend Cardinal Gibbons

After graduation from a school that was only beginning to establish the traditions and rituals that would carry it forward, Ott attended the University of Notre Dame, a school steeped in tradition. During the era of Coach Ara Parsegian and a National Championship, he learned that an exceptional academic program and an exceptional athletic program were not mutually exclusive. In fact, the spirit and enthusiasm generated from the athletic program carried over into the classroom so that the chant "We're Number One" applied to the pride students

had in the entire school, not just football.


Returning to Cardinal Gibbons as a teacher, student activities director, assistant principal and then principal, the lessons learned about the importance of an excellent athletic program as a compliment to an excellent academic program remained with him. Unwilling to compromise on academic standards and moral values, he encouraged all students to be the best people they could be first, and then to fulfill their potential as students, athletes, and contributing team members, regardless of skill level. All students had to be held to the same standards. He truly believed that it is not whether you win or lose, but how you played the game that mattered most. This is not to say that winning was not the preferred outcome, especially against certain cross town rivals.

In addition to the continuous improvement of the academic facilities on campus, Ott worked with former AD Louise Crocco and current AD Mike Morrill in overseeing the funding and construction of the gym lobby and second floor practice gym, the contracted legal battle

for lights on the football field, the synthetic track and Bud Tight athletic field, and the baseball dugout and concession stand.

He made a concerted effort to attend as many athletic events as possible to support the students and coaches who dedicated so much time and effort in service to their school. His door was always open and he tried to create a comfortable space and safe zone for students who were experiencing difficulty in their lives. Like former inductee Pauline Milano, he truly believed that "It's all about the kids" and that was his primary focus during his 48 year tenure.
