- Develop interventions to reach goals

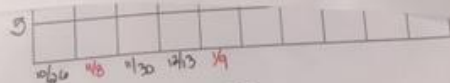
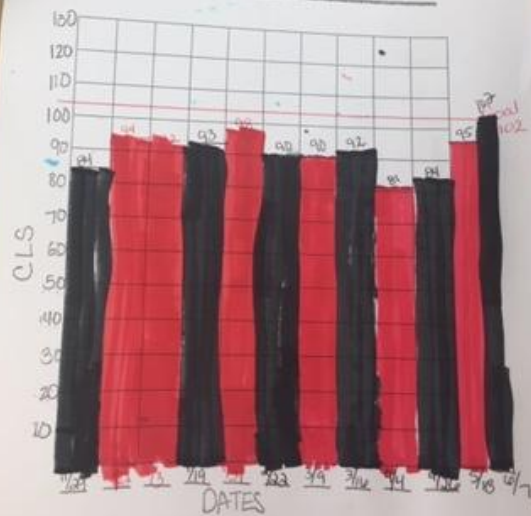

Goal: Spell 3<sup>rd</sup> grade level words and score 102 correct letter sequences (CLS) 3X each

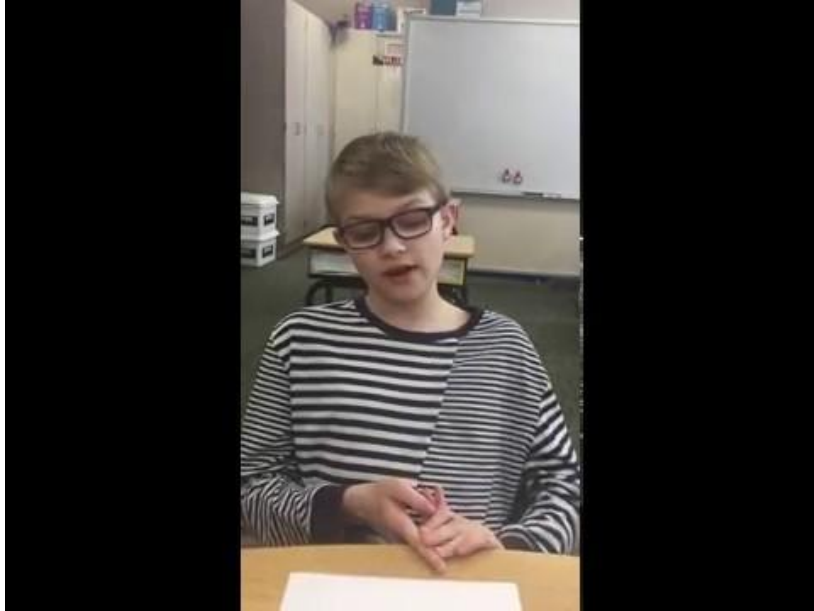


## TRANSITION VIDEOS
