When you take information to use in a paper, you **must** indicate the source. This is true for ideas or information you rewrite into your own words, as well as for facts, statistics, quotations, and indirect references. It is not necessary to provide citations for common information that is found in many sources (i.e. Shakespeare's birthday).

Your Works Cited list will appear at the end of your paper. Alphabetize by the author or editor's last name, double-space the entire list, and format with hanging indentation.

Use the most recent copyright date and include a period at the end of each entry.
