# **Pick Up Your Students Meds!!!**

Pick Up Students' Medicine, Inhalers, Epi-Pens, etc.

Parents you MUST personally come to the office to pick up student meds-before 4:30 on Monday, June 10. June 11, 12 & 13 are half days.


Medicine left at school after June 13, 2019 will be disposed of.

Remember, prior to the start of the next school year (*Tuesday, August 27*), your child's physician needs to complete an AM ("*Authorization for Medication*") form (available on the Costello website under Forms). This form must accompany any medication to be distributed during school hours. All medicine MUST be brought (in its original bottle/box/container) to the office by the parent. If a parent prefers, students grades 3rd-5th, may keep inhalers used for asthma with them, providing appropriate forms are completed in advance. Children may not bring any medication to school, including over-the-counter cough medicine, etc., without an "Authorization for Medication" form on file in the school office.

# 2019/2020 TEACHERS FOR NEXT YEAR

#### **GRADE PLACEMENT PROCEDURES**

With the end of the school year fast approaching, parents may have questions regarding our "Grade Placement Procedures" for moving students to their next grade level teacher for the following school year. Please do not approach your child's current teacher asking for a specific teacher placement. The following systematic procedures are used district wide to appropriately place students.

Current teachers complete a student profile form for each student in his/her class The profile sheet allows teachers to identify individual student strengths and needs.

A team consisting of the current grade level teachers, principal, and other pertinent staff such as the reading specialist, special education personnel, and/or ELL teacher will meet to place students into classes based on information from the profile sheets and additional insights provided from a variety of sources. The class lists will be constructed so that each class is relatively equal with regard to gender, ethnicity, academic abilities, and social-emotional developmental levels

A team consisting of pertinent staff will meet a second time to review the class lists and make any necessary changes to reflect any changes in enrollment, personnel, etc. that take place during the summer.

Requests for a specific teacher cannot be considered; however, concerned parents may send a letter (before June 10, 2019) to the principal describing information regarding their child's learning style.

Parents will be informed (via email-message) of teacher placement the week before school starts—Tuesday, August 27 (half-day).
