Deacon Art Miller was arrested and jailed during the summer of 1963 for sitting in silent protest over the sustained use of racial bigotry to separate black Americans from the imbued rights of all Americans. He grew up on the South Side of Chicago. In 1955, his schoolmate Emmett Till was brutally murdered in Mississippi for allegedly whistling at a white woman - an incident that energized the Civil Rights Movement.

He believes strongly in standing up for justice and hopes to motivate all of us, especially the young, to stand up for what is right and just.

Deacon Art Miller will be speaking on Tuesday, May 21, 2019 at 6:30 pm Civil Rights community to join us as he shares his story with the Social Justice community.

Deacon Art Miller


Deacon Art Miller is a veteran civil rights worker who was arrested and jailed during the summer of 1963 for sitting in silent protest over the sustained use of racial bigotry to separate black Americans from the imbued rights of all Americans.

Deacon Art Miller has committed his life to social justice. He grew up on the South Side of Chicago. Deacon Miller was brutally murdered in 1955 when his schoolmate Emmett Till was brutally murdered in Mississippi for allegedly whistling at a woman—an incident that energized the Civil Rights Movement.

Deacon Art Miller believes strongly in standing up for justice and hopes to motivate all of us, especially the young, to stand up for what is right and just.
