

### Medication Pickup:

If your student has medication in the health room, it must be picked up by 4pm on the last day of school, June 24th. If you will not be attending that day, please make arrangements for pick up on your student's last day. **All medication must be picked up by an adult, it cannot be sent home with students. Medication left at school after 4pm on the last day will be destroyed.** Since we are required to use a medication waste service for disposing of all leftover medication, this is extremely costly for every school site that needs a pick up. We appreciate your consideration in picking up all medications.

•A copy of your students Immunization records from your provider's office is required for new students entering Arrowhead at the time of registration or by the first day of school. **Please note: As of July 28th 2019, a personal exemption for the MMR vaccine is no longer allowed per Wa state law. Children without up-to-date immunizations may not enter school. State law does not allow for a grace period. A child will not be assigned to a classroom until immunization forms are complete.**

- Year end reports cards will be mailed home by June 28<sup>th</sup>.
- If your child/ren will not be attending Arrowhead next year, please call the office (425-408-4000) with this information. It will help us determine class counts at each grade level. We will also be able to have student records ready to send to the new school when we receive the request.

## OPENING OF THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL

The following information will be helpful to you as we approach the 2019-2020 school year. You may wish to keep this in a convenient place for easy reference.

- The all school **Open House** is Wednesday, August 28<sup>th</sup> from 5:15-6:00pm
- **PTA Welcome Back Night** follows the open house and is from 6:00-7:30pm
- We anticipate mailing your child's class assignment along with other important school information by August 26<sup>th</sup>. **Please do not ask for this information in advance. Assignments are finalized just prior to mailing.**
- Our Transportation Department will be mailing information regarding bus routes in August.
- All kindergarten parents will receive an information packet in late August including teacher assignment.
- Immunization information for kindergarten and new students entering Arrowhead in the fall must be submitted at the time of registration or by the first day of school.
- Current bell times for Arrowhead for the 2019-2020 school year are: 9:30am and 3:50pm. **Students will be tardy after 9:30am.** Early release is 2:20pm.
- The first day of school for 2019-2020 is scheduled to begin on Wednesday, September 4, 2019 for grades 1<sup>st</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>.
- Kindergarten students will start school three days after grades 1<sup>st</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup>. This is to allow for kindergarten parent teacher conferences prior to the start of school. Kindergarten students will have a staggered start with half of the class attending on Monday, September 9<sup>th</sup>, the other half attending on Tuesday, September 10<sup>th</sup>, and the full class together on Wednesday, September 11<sup>th</sup>.
- Most Wednesdays school will be dismissed at 2:20pm. September 4<sup>th</sup> will be a full day. September 11<sup>th</sup> will be our first early release at 2:20pm.
- A Basic Student Supply List (per grade) will be posted on the Arrowhead website during the summer at <http://arrowhead.nsd.org> Please wait until after school has started to buy supplies other than those on the list. Teachers may include a few additional items for their particular classroom when the class list is sent in August.

## Ready Start Program

Our new Ready Start program is a blended multi-age, inclusive model, serving students, ages 3-5. We are currently enrolling at both locations (Sorenson and Cottage Lake Elementary) for the 19/20 school year. Classrooms are taught and supported by a general education teacher, a special education teacher, and a para professional. Inclusive classrooms create a dynamic learning environment for all students. The average class size is 16 students, with class make-up of 8 students with IEP's, 5 students who pay tuition, and 3 students who are income eligible. Classrooms utilize The Creative Curriculum & Teaching Strategies GOLD Assessment Tool. The staff is committed to fostering student learning and cultivating friendships while creating a sense of community for our students. Utilizing developmentally appropriate teaching strategies to support a whole child approach to learning, within an inclusive environment, fosters high levels of student learning and social and emotional growth for all students.

## Virtual Reality at Arrowhead!

Many classes had the opportunity to use Virtual Reality to go on exciting field trips, right from their own classrooms. We travelled to outer space, the Galapagos Islands, Colonial Times, and museums around the world to explore dinosaurs. Students were able to travel to and explore locations and animals they might not otherwise be able to visit. Students put on virtual wet suits to scuba dive the Great Barrier Reef, down parkas to observe polar bears at the North Pole and life vests to cruise down the Amazon.

Fifth grade classes toured the Jamestown Colony and Civil War locations as well as exploring fluid to help bring their science lessons to life. Fourth grade classes travelled to the Grand Coulee Dam to help in their study of the Columbia River and examined the inside of volcanos as well as volcanoes around the world. Third grade classes visited National Parks across North America and even walked a 3 mile trail through the Grand Tetons. To wrap up their study of polar bears, they also observed them in the tundra. Second grade classes examined animals that live in extreme places to coincide with their research on animals. First grade flew into outer space and dove under water with sharks.


