



## Centennial Junior High School Safe Routes to School 2019-2020

The **Centennial Junior High School Safe Routes to School Plan** provides students and parents with information to allow students to safely arrive to school.

The walking areas of Centennial Junior High School (<2 miles from the school) are divided into four geographic regions:

**Section A: the northwest walking region** – just north of 200 North – Flint Street – Smith Lane – furthest west homes

- A. **Safest Route:** students are expected to connect to the Denver and Rio Grande Trail (hereafter called the Rail Trail) and travel south to east/west section of the trail to the school.
- B. **Alternate Route:** students may travel south on Angel Street.
- C. **Safety Concerns:** intermittent sidewalks from 200 North to Gailbrath Lane.

**Section B: the northeast walking region** – 200 North - I15 Freeway – east/west section of the Rail Trail leading to the school – Flint Street

- A. **Safest Route:** students are expected to connect to the Rail Trail and travel south to east/west section of the trail to the school.
- B. **Alternate Route:** students may travel south on Flint Street connecting to Sunset Drive.
- C. **Safety Concerns:** intermittent sidewalks on Flint street to the school.

**Section C: the southwest walking region** – Smith Lane – Sunset Drive – just south of Burton Lane – furthest west homes

- A. **Safest Route:** travel north on Sunset Drive.
- B. **Safety Concerns:** intermittent sidewalks on Sunset Drive.

**Section D: the southeast walking region** – east/west section of the Rail Trail – I15 Freeway – just south of Burton Lane – Sunset Drive

- A. **Safest Route:** students are expected to connect to the Rail Trail and travel north to the east/west section of the Rail Trail to the school.
- B. **Alternate Route:** travel north on Sunset Drive.
- C. **Safety Concerns:** intermittent sidewalks on Sunset Drive.
