Your First Grade teachers are eager to see what their students chose to read over the summer!





This poetry collection has been delighting readers for decades. Enjoy the silly poems and fun illustrations with your family.




## The Book With No Pictures by B.J. Novak

and fun for emerging readers.




### National Geographic Kids First Big Book of Why by Amy Shields

### Mercy Watson to the Rescue By Kate DiCamillo


This is the first in a delightful series about a pig who is the adored daughter of a human mother and father. Young readers will enjoy the story of her antics in short, heavily-



### Meet Mr. and Mrs. Green by Keith Baker


illustrated chapters.
