Do You Have Concerns About Your Child's Development?

Though children develop at their own individual rates, the following are basic developmental skills your child should have:

Birth to Three Months:

- Lifts head and chest when on stomach
- Startles or cries at sudden loud noises
- Smiles in response to your smile or talk
- Moves arms and legs easily
- Quiets easily when comforted

Three to Six Months:

- Plays with his feet when on his back
- Holds head upright and steady without support
- Reaches for toy
- Laughs out loud
- Rolls from stomach to back

Six to Twelve Months:

- Pulls himself to stand with some help
- Imitates waving bye-bye
- Copies speech sounds
- Knows parents from strangers
- Feeds herself with finger food

At One Year:

- > Walks alone
- Puts objects into a container and dumps them out
- Says two or three words in addition to "Mama" and "Dada"
- Points to things when named
- Understands simple questions
- Imitates waving bye-bye

At Two Years:

- Walks well, runs, stops, steps up and squats down
- Uses spoon and cup by herself when eating
- Names five to six body parts
- Answers simple "what" questions
- Helps with simple tasks
- Takes off clothes
- Scribbles
- Puts two words together (More juice)

At Three Years:

- Runs without falling
- Throws a ball
- Stacks more than two objects
- Washes and dries hands
- Follows two step directions
- Enjoys playing alone
- Points to or names objects
- Copies adults doing daily activities (combing hair, brushing teeth)

At Four Years:

- Enjoys tumbling or other games that use large muscles
- Draws a face that looks like a face
- Says most speech sounds clearly except for s, z, th, r
- Says own first and last name

- Copies a circle
- Asks "why" and "what" questions
- Plays with other children
- Hops on one foot

At Five Years:

- > Enjoys catching, throwing, kicking a ball
- Enjoys cutting with scissors
- Shows interest in writing words
- Copies a square
- Uses longer and complete sentences
- Shares and takes turns
- Dresses self including buttoning, snapping and zippering
