



Articulation Agreement

Between Urban College and Fisher College

1. Fisher College assures the acceptance of an early childhood associate degree graduate who has earned a grade point average of 2.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) in to their Bachelor of Science in Human Services degree and Bachelor of Science in Human Services degree with early childhood education concentration. Students accepted with over 60 transfer credits will be classified as juniors.
2. Transfer students will receive academic credit for all college-level courses applied toward the requirements of the associate degree, accepting grades of C- or higher. A maximum of 66 credits can be accepted.
3. Non-credit or remedial courses adjudged to be below college level may not be accepted for transfer.
4. It is understood that if a student does not have the foundation or skill to enroll in an upper level course because he/she has not taken introductory courses, he/she will be required to take the necessary prerequisite(s). Therefore, Fisher College cannot assure every student the completion of requirements for the bachelor degree in 4 semesters.
5. The Fisher College catalog contains all information about the degree requirements. Students wishing to plan their associate degree program to ensure meeting prerequisites for upper level courses are encouraged to communicate early with an admissions counselor at Fisher College to secure specific information about their transfer credits.
6. Fisher College agrees to conduct Fisher College courses on-site at Urban College if student demand exists. If not, Fisher College courses will be taught at the Fisher College Beacon Street campus.
7. This agreement will be reviewed bi-annually and may be revised by mutual agreement.
8. Both colleges agree to the right to use each other's names in print materials and media advertising. All materials must be approved by the respective communications and/or marketing offices at the partner college.
9. This agreement is expected to continue in force indefinitely but may be terminated by either party with not less than one year's notice.
