

Articulation Agreement High School
Bristol-Plymouth Regional Technical School and Fisher College


1. Bristol-Plymouth Regional Technical School graduates that have earned a minimum grade point average of 2.0 will be granted admission into a bachelor or associate degree at Fisher College. Applicants must meet all other admissions requirements and complete the application process.
2. Bristol-Plymouth Regional Technical School Early Childhood program has been evaluated for equivalency for college credit and will be accepted according to Credit Equivalency Table -- Exhibit A. This program is only offered in the Fisher College continuing education division.
3. Bristol-Plymouth Regional Technical School will assure the curriculum as identified in Exhibit A is taught according to the approved standards by a properly credentialed faculty including both academic and professional credentials.
4. It is understood that if a student does not have the foundation or skill to enroll in an upper level course because he/she has not taken introductory courses, he/she will be required to take the necessary prerequisite(s). Therefore, Fisher College cannot assure every student the completion of requirements for the bachelor/associate's degree in a specific number of terms or semesters.
5. The Fisher College catalog contains all information about the degree requirements. Students wishing to plan their bachelor/associate's degree program to ensure meeting prerequisites for upper level courses are encouraged to communicate early with an admissions counselor at Fisher College to secure specific information about their credits.
6. This agreement will be reviewed bi-annually and may be revised by mutual agreement.
7. Both Fisher College and Bristol-Plymouth Regional Technical School agree to the right to use each other's names in print materials and media advertising. All materials must be approved by the respective communications and/or marketing offices at the partner college.
8. This agreement is expected to continue in force indefinitely but may be terminated by either party with not less than one year's notice.

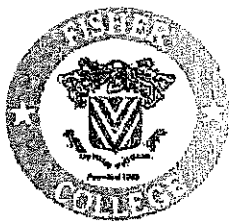
