





## Articulation Agreement

Between Nashoba Valley Technical High School and Fisher College

1. Fisher College assures the acceptance of Nashoba Valley Technical High School program graduate who has earned a grade point average of 2.5 or higher in to their Early Education and Care Program.  
  
Students will receive academic credit for all courses applied toward the requirements of the associate degree, accepting grades of C or higher. The acceptance credit from Nashoba Valley Technical High School graduates is guaranteed for the curriculum/courses reviewed by Fisher College as of the date of this agreement. Earlier versions of their curriculum do not apply for this agreement.
2. Nashoba Valley Technical High School courses have been evaluated for equivalency for college credit and will be accepted according to Transfer Table – Exhibit A.
3. Nashoba Valley Technical High School will assure the curriculum as identified below is taught according to the materials provided and by a properly credentialed faculty member (bachelor's degree required, master's degree preferred) including both academic and professional credentials.
4. It is understood that if a student does not have the foundation or skill to enroll in an upper level course because he/she has not taken introductory courses, he/she will be required to take the necessary prerequisite(s). Therefore, Fisher College cannot assure every student the completion of requirements for the associate degree in 4 semesters.
5. The Fisher College catalog contains all information about the degree requirements. Students wishing to plan their associate degree program to ensure meeting prerequisites for upper level courses are encouraged to communicate early with an admissions counselor at Fisher College to secure specific information about their transfer credits.
6. This agreement will be reviewed bi-annually and may be revised by mutual agreement.
7. Both Fisher College and Nashoba Valley Technical High School agree to the right to use each other's names in print materials and media advertising. All materials must be approved by the respective communications and/or marketing offices at the partner college.
8. This agreement is expected to continue in force indefinitely but may be terminated by either party with not less than one year's notice.


