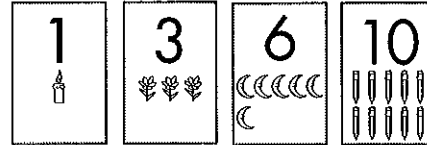


How Many of Each?

Double Compare

You need

- deck of Primary Number Cards (without Wild Cards)



Play with a partner.

- 1 Deal the cards facedown.
- 2 Both players turn over their top two cards.
- 3 The player with the larger total says "Me!" and takes the cards. If the totals are the same, both players turn over two more cards.
- 4 Keep turning over two cards. Each time, the player with the larger total says "Me!" and takes the cards.
- 5 The game is over when there are no more cards to turn over.

More Ways to Play

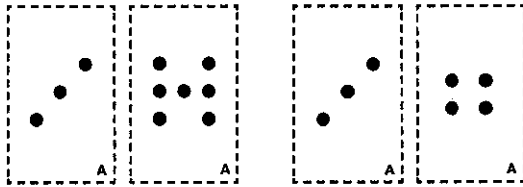
- The player with the **smaller** total says "Me!"
- Play with 3 players.
- Play with the Wild Cards. A Wild Card can be any number.



Double Compare Dots

You need

- Dot Cards



Play with a partner.

- 1 Deal the cards facedown.
- 2 Both players turn over their top two cards.
- 3 The player with cards having more dots says "Me!" and takes the cards. If both pairs of cards have the same number of dots, both players turn over two more cards.
- 4 Keep turning over two cards. Each time, the player with more dots says "Me!" and takes the cards.
- 5 The game is over when there are no more cards in the deck.

More Ways to Play

- The player whose cards have **fewer** dots say "Me!"
- Play with 3 players.



Questions for Double Compare

Questions to ask before:

- What numbers did you turn over?

Questions to ask during:

- What is the total?
- How do you know?
- How can use you the pictures to help you?
- Which number is smaller?
- Which number is larger?
- How do you know which number is larger?
- Can you tell me how many dots there are without counting them all?

Questions to ask after:

- Record equations using $>$, $<$, or $=$.
