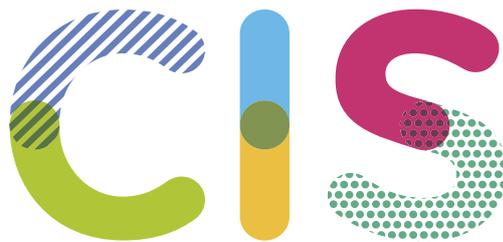

This summary pertains to the 189 page report received from CIS on the 19th April 2019. That full report will be available on the school's website for the whole community as well as this summary.

The outcome of the Team Visit (9-15 March 2019) is that Shrewsbury Riverside has achieved re-accredited status.

The report is divided into eight domains:

- Domain A** Purpose and Direction
- Domain B** Governance, Leadership and Ownership
- Domain C** The Curriculum (subdivided into Junior/ Senior reports)
- Domain D** Teaching and Assessing for Learning (subdivided into Junior/Senior reports)
- Domain E** The Students' Learning and Wellbeing
- Domain F** Staffing
- Domain G** Premises and Physical Accommodation
- Domain H** Community and Home Partnerships

There were three areas where the school's excellence was 'self evident' in the report. They are:

- Domain B** Governance, Leadership and Ownership
- Domain E** The Students' Learning and Wellbeing
- Domain F** Staffing

The Evaluation Team noted the main areas for development is:

The documentation of the vertical articulation of the curriculum from Pre-Prep to Senior School

All recommendations have been entered into the Operational Plan August 2019 draft.

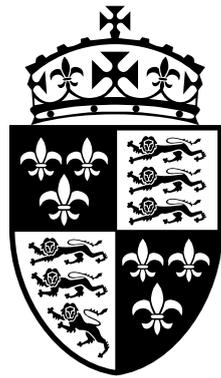
