When I was in the fourth grade, I traveled to Europe for the first time. I was a member of a fife and drum corps, the Mount Vernon Guard, and we were invited to play in the St. Patrick's Day parade in Dublin Ireland. During that visit, I saw a professional soccer game and the accompanying wild soccer fans for the first time. I have been a fan ever since.
