- **ATTENTION JUNIORS who took the ACT on April 24<sup>th</sup>:** Are you planning to take the ACT on June 8<sup>th</sup>, July 13<sup>th</sup>, or Fall of your Senior Year? If so, you need to create an account on the ACT website. Go to <https://www.act.org> to create an online student account. Once you create an account, you will be asked two questions: -Have you registered before..... You should answer "no". -Have taken the ACT before..... You should answer "yes". Then, the accounts will be merged so you will have access to your April 24<sup>th</sup> score report (once available) and future ACT score reports. Make sure you register with the exact same information you used when you "bubbled in" your answer document for the test on the April 24<sup>th</sup>. Please see your counselor or Mr. Miller in the CRC if you have questions OR you can call ACT at 319.337.1270.
- **Texting and Driving FYI:** It is illegal for drivers of **all ages** to compose, read, or send electronic messages or access the internet on a wireless device when the vehicle is in motion or part of traffic. This **includes** being stopped in traffic or at a light. It is illegal for drivers under age 18 to use a cell phone, whether hand-held or hands-free — except to call 911 in an emergency.
