Special Education Advisory Council Guidelines

SEAC Purpose

The Eden Prairie Schools Special Education Advisory Council is a group of parents and school staff who work with the Student Support Services Department on advising and sharing information specific to special education in the district. Members of SEAC make themselves available to the school's community of special educations families as a resource for support.

Mission Statement

The mission of the Eden Prairie Schools Special Education Advisory Council (SEAC) is to act as an advisory body to the District on behalf of students receiving special education services. SEAC will work towards the district mission of: *Inspiring each student, every day*.

Membership

Under Minnesota rule, at least half of the SEAC membership must be parents of students with a disability. Parents should plan to commit to SEAC membership for a minimum of 2 years. The Executive Director of Student Support Services and a parent designated as the SEAC Chair will meet prior to each SEAC meeting to plan the meeting agenda, with input from parents and staff.

Responsibility of Membership:

- Be an effective SEAC participant by asking questions about anything you don't understand. Be willing to listen first.
- Learn about the people, the issues, the programs, and background information before offering advice or opinions.
- Be willing to say "I don't know yet" or "I need more information in order to comment about that issue"
- Learn all you can about the District structure, policy, and administration.
- Come prepared to contribute.
- Develop an understanding of the "big picture" issues facing the district, beyond those of your own child/student.
