Eligibility:

Bachelor Degree students

- Students in a Bachelor Degree program must have completed a minimum of 90 college level credit hours.
- Student must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3.

Guidelines:

- Course should be conducted during a regular term (either 16 or 8 week terms), although in rare situations, some flexibility is allowed.
- Course will count as an elective (free, humanities, social science, computer science, or math/science) depending on the content and approval of AD, VPAA and curriculum committee.
- Course will be designated with an appropriate code and given the level (200, 300 or 400) based on faculty and curriculum committee recommendation.
- Can be administered by full time faculty or adjunct with appropriate credentials.
- Must be developed and approved prior to start of the semester in which it will be conducted.
- May be in any area of study, not limited to the major.
