 May 14, 2019 Regular Meeting Minutes

**Mooreville Graded School District Board of Education
 Regular Monthly Meeting, Tuesday, May 14, 2019, 6:00 p.m.**

The Board of Education of the Mooreville Graded School District met in regular monthly session on Tuesday, May 14, 2019, in the Community Meeting Room at Mooreville Town Hall.

Present were Mr. Roger Hyatt, Chairman; Mr. Greg Whitfield, Vice Chairman; Mr. Leon Pridgen; Dr. Debbie Marsh; and Mrs. Kerry Pennell.

Superintendent Dr. Stephen Mauney and Attorney Kevin Donaldson were present. Dr. Todd Black, Assistant Superintendent for Secondary Instruction and CTE; Dr. Scott Smith, Assistant Superintendent for Elementary Instruction and Technology; Dr. Ingrid Medlock, Assistant Superintendent for Human Resources; Dr. Michael Royal, Chief Operations Officer; and Mrs. Tanae McLean, Chief Communications Officer were present.

Mr. Hyatt called the meeting to order, shared words of encouragement for students and teachers as they approach the end of the school year and exams, and held a moment of silence. Students from South Elementary School; Gabriela Salazar and Ashton Wilson led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment: Parent and former teacher Michelle Ross, 210 Devon Forest Drive, Mooreville, NC, 28115, addressed the board on her concerns receiving prompt safety communication from the district. She also would like parents and district to collaborate and work together to help keep all students safe.

On a motion by Dr. Marsh, seconded by Mr. Whitfield, the board voted unanimously to approve the meeting agenda as amended to add the following; item VII - Approval of Proclamation, and item E - Public Communication Report.

On a motion by Mrs. Pennell, seconded by Mr. Pridgen, the board voted unanimously to approve the minutes of the April 9, 2019, meeting as presented.

Approval of Proclamation: Dr. Mauney and Mr. Hyatt presented the Proclamation honoring Police Officer, Jordan Sheldon of the Mooreville Police Department, who died serving our community on May 4, 2019; and the Mooreville Police Department, who serves our school district and community dutifully and with honor. The Proclamation will be shared with the Mooreville Police Department. **On a motion by Mr. Whitfield, seconded by Dr. Marsh, the board voted unanimously to approve the Proclamation as presented.**

The next school board meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 11, 2019, at the Mooreville Town Hall beginning at 6:00 p.m.

Staff Report:

- A. Facilities and Construction Report: Dr. Royal advised mega units are being delivered and installed at Park View Elementary School. He indicated Mooresville High School has received the Certificate of Occupancy, and the items on the punch list are still in the process of completion. He advised MGSD has received a Safety Equipment Grant that will provide the district with cameras, monitors, DVR's, exterior lighting at MHS, and door & window safety coverings. Dr. Royal provided an athletic update for Mooresville High School and Mooresville Middle School. At Mooresville High School, both baseball and softball teams have advanced to the 3rd round of the State Playoffs, in track and field 7 students have advanced to the State Meet, and the boy's track team has won the Conference. At Mooresville Middle School, girl's soccer team is 15-1, and will compete in the Championship game.
- B. Instructional Report: Dr. Scott Smith advised he will present the board with the 2019-2022 District AIG Plan in first reading and will ask for approval at the June board meeting. He reported on the end of year activities and EOG preparations occurring at the K-6 schools. EOG's (end of grade) exams will begin next week. Dr. Smith stated, the 2019 MGSD Summer Institute will be held at Mooresville High School on Thursday, July 25 & Friday, July 26, 2019. Student laptop collection will begin before school ends and plans for laptop deployment is underway. Dr. Black provided secondary school updates. At MHS, AP (Advanced Placement) exams are almost complete and the senior capstone projects will be presented on May 15, 2019. He advised end of year exams at both MMS and MHS will begin in 8-11 days. Dr. Black shared Teacher Appreciation Week went well at the secondary schools. He thanked everyone that provided teachers with many special treats during the week.
- C. Human Resources: Dr. Medlock wished congratulations to all of the beginning teachers that completed the MGSD 3-year Beginning Teaching Program. A small graduation was held to commemorate their completion of the program. Dr. Medlock announced the school level TOY's (Teachers of the Year) and BOY's (Beginning Teachers of the Year) winners. **EMIS** - TOY, Kaylor Kaemba, BTOY, Julie McKeon; **MIS** - TOY, Kimberlie DeVerna, BTOY, Page Turritin; **RRES** - TOY, Stacie Eisenhofer, BTOY, Catherine Daniels; **PVES** - TOY, Chaunte Neely, BTOY, Leanne Rose; **SES** - TOY, Cheryl Rogers, BTOY, Jillian Campbell; **MMS** - TOY, Angela Ketchie, BTOY, John Bustle; **MHS** - TOY, Brent "Dewey" Bustle, BTOY, Mackenzie Ballard. The Teacher Of the Year Committee will begin to review each candidate and will announce the 2019-2020 district winners in August. Dr. Medlock advised it is hiring season and MGSD is accepting applications for current vacancies. She stated contract renewals for licensed staff are underway and teacher licenses will need to be renewed by June 27, 2019.
- D. Public Communication Report: Mrs. McLean reported the Plugged in Parent Event held on April 22, 2019, at the High School PAC was a successful event attended by 80 participants. This event was held to inform parents and students on how to properly use social media. On May 3, 2019, the Mooresville High School Diversity Ambassador Club held its first cultural event in celebration of the cultural diversity at MHS. A diversity website is now available for staff. The district is making plans to provide a public site as well. Mrs. McLean shared, the Change-A- Life Mentoring Breakfast was held last week

for students and their mentors. She stated the district is exploring ways to get more staff and community members involved in the program. Mrs. Mclean advised the United Way in Iredell County is sponsoring the “Longest Table Event” in Statesville, NC, on May 21, 2019. This community table event is being held to bring community members from all different backgrounds & income levels to share food, conversation, and foster new friendships.

- E. Superintendent’s Report: Dr. Mauney discussed the recent threats made via social media against Mooresville Middle School and Mooresville High School. He assured everyone that the district is working closely with the Mooresville Police Department and the Iredell County Sheriff’s Department to determine the source of the postings. MGSD will always be vigilant in investigating threats in order to maintain a safe environment for staff and students and will take school disciplinary and legal action against those involved. Dr. Mauney shared the 2019 Mooresville High School graduation will be held on Saturday, June 8, 2019, beginning at 8:30 a.m. at the Joe Popp Stadium. He stated each graduation ceremony is a community celebration that all of our teachers share in making possible. Dr. Mauney advised the format of our board meetings have been adjusted to provide our community with the chance to hear of upcoming events and details shared by the Executive Team. In the past, this information was provided at the Consent Agenda Meeting held prior to the larger meeting and although it was open to the public very few member of the public attended. He hopes everyone will find this new format informative.

ABCD Award: The Above and Beyond the Call of Duty Award was presented to Tammy Wolfe, Teacher Assistant at Mooresville High School. MHS, Principal, Mr. Eric Schwarzenegger nominated her. In the nomination he wrote; “On paper, Ms. Tammy Wolfe’s title is Teacher Assistant, but in reality the title of “School Assistant” is probably more accurate. As a Teacher Assistant in our OCS program, Tammy works with a team of teachers and TAs to deliver instruction and coach students through life lessons. Everyday I have the privilege of witnessing Ms. Tammy teaching, mentoring, and in some cases parenting her students to ensure they are successful in high school and beyond. But that just describes Ms. Tammy’s regular job. Tammy also drives the bus for students that go to job sites during the school day and for our athletic teams in the afternoon. Not to mention the countless times she has filled in as a substitute driver for transportation at a moment’s notice. Instructional Highlights: South Elementary School - Breakout EDU Kits
Dr. Mark Cottone, Principal at South Elementary School introduced teachers, Ms. Pollock, Ms. McCrorey and Ms. Zsuppan who shared and explained how they are utilizing the Breakout EDU kits to help their 3rd-graders prepare for the EOG’s (End Of Grade) testing. These breakout sessions are teaching students team building, and critical thinking skills. Through these challenging & engaging breakout lessons, students get the opportunity to apply reading and math skills to review skills in new and exciting ways. South Elementary has 4 kits that are used on rotation in the classroom. They will soon hold a family Breakout EOG night, which brings families together to work as a team. Teachers can utilize the templates to create breakout boxes that meet the specific needs of their students. Board Members were provided with theses kits to give them a breakout experience.

Mr. Herman Newton was honored at the May 14, 2019, Board of Education meeting. Mr. Newton is a retired Mooresville Graded School District teacher that taught at Mooresville High School for 31 years. He is an award winning Master Bricklayer that continues to work behind the scenes at Mooresville High School to help with repairs and restorations. Recently, Mr. Newton repaired the cornerstone in front of MHS. Dr. Mauney reflected on his positive

experiences with Mr. Herman back in the '90s when he first began teaching at MHS. He thanked him on behalf of the Mooresville Graded School District for all of his help throughout the years. Mr. Newton shared he was pleased to be able to help with the restorations and presented Dr. Mauney with a picture of the Old Mooresville Senior High School that was located at Center Avenue. His brother, Mr. Richard Newton, drew this picture.

Presentation of 2019-2022 District AIG Plan: Dr. Scott Smith presented and explained the 2019-2022 District AIG Plan for first reading. This plan will be reviewed and brought for approval at the June board meeting.

Approval of 2019-2020 CTE Plan: Dr. Black introduced Mrs. Julie Blocker, the coordinator for the MGSD Career and Technical Education (CTE) program. Mrs. Blocker shared and explained the 2019-2020 CTE Local plan, the projected expenses, and the application for funding. She shared highlights of the current CTE program, provided information on the certifications earned by students, and shared the various events held throughout the year to help raise money for the program. Mrs. Blocker shared MGSD held its first SkillsUSA signing day on May 8, 2019. Students signed employee contracts offered to them by local employers. These students will work at these companies after they graduate. **On a motion by Dr. Marsh, seconded by Mr. Pridgen, the board voted unanimously to approve the 2019-2020 CTE Plan as presented.**

Approval of 2018-2019 Calendar Changes: Dr. Royal presented and explained the changes in the 2018-2019 school year calendar. May 1, 2019 was changed from a regular instructional day to an optional teacher workday; May 8, 2019 was changed from an early release day to a regular instructional day; and on Friday, May 10, 2019, schools were dismissed 3.5 hours early to accommodate the traffic due to the police funeral procession. Dr. Royal advised with the above changes, MGSD has a cushion of 0.6 instructional hours for the 2018-2019 school year. **On a motion by Mr. Whitfield, seconded by Mr. Pridgen, the board voted unanimously to approve the 2018-2019 school year calendar as presented.**

Mr. Hyatt, under G.S. §143-318.11 (a)(6) & (a)(3), announced the board would go into closed session to review personnel and consult with the board attorney. **On a motion by Ms. Pennell, seconded by Dr. Marsh, the board voted unanimously to go into closed session.**

On a motion by Mr. Pridgen, seconded by Mr. Whitfield, the board voted unanimously to adjourn from closed session.
