HEALTH SCIENCES LIBRARY CONNECTIONS

The Library is a hub for many types of connections. While people might think of the Library as a place, what really comprises the Library is its staff members who connect with one another and others to:

- staff the circulation desk and keep the facility open for 102.5 hours per week
- select appropriate collection materials (both physical and virtual) based on information needs
- purchase, organize, and make accessible all the print and electronic resources
- provide and maintain banks of computers for classes, exams, and individual use
- organize LibGuides customized for departments or particular classes
- serve as liaisons to departments
- provide interlibrary loan services
- check out educational resources, leisure materials, chargers, and study rooms
- answer reference questions and perform expert literature searches
- offer eclectic exhibits (both original creations and borrowed ones)
- organize, preserve and digitize historical materials for the institution
- teach information skills, such as database searching and critical appraisal
- create and maintain web pages that connect users with needed information
- provide health information literacy outreach to the public
- alert you to new resources and services via multiple communication methods--newsletter, email, web pages, institution newsletter
- provide writing assistance for personal statements, papers and manuscripts

The Library facility would be nothing without the librarians and support staff. The physical materials would not be organized without them, nor would the electronic materials be accessible without them. As you will see on page 7, one survey respondent commented that "The staff is probably the best feature of the Library." We library folks enjoy the many connections that bind us together with the faculty, staff and students of the School of Medicine, the School of Graduate Studies, and the School of Allied Health Professions. We also enjoy connecting with hospital employees and patients, as well as members of the public who are consumers of health information. We reach beyond the local area to connect with our counterparts at other libraries so that we can learn from one another and share best practices. 

EDUCATING THE CAMPUS

We connect with students and staff to educate them about using reliable resources for research and for answering clinical questions, as well as the importance of critical appraisal of the literature.


In addition to their traditional curriculum and Library-initiated classes, Library faculty taught with different methods in 2014/2015.

Translating Research into Practice (TRIP)

- Library faculty led new activities as part of TRIP, the campus Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP).
 - During Freshman Immersion, Library faculty facilitated small groups of medical students, designed to teach the skills to form answerable clinical questions for evidence-based practice.
 - Library faculty were facilitators for the second-year medical student Mock Epidemiologic Investigation. Students were assigned multiple cases, all with a common pathogen, and used Library point-of-care resources to conduct an investigation and present their findings in small groups.
 - Julie Esparza, clinical medical librarian, taught the Journal Critical Analysis module during Fundamentals of Medicine II for second-year medical students.

Public Health Elective on Moodle

- Will Olmstadt, associate director, developed and taught a 3 credit hour elective in public health informatics and geographic information systems, for the Master of Public Health program.
- The course was delivered entirely on the School of Allied Health Professions Moodle site, June-July 2015.



Library faculty secured \$35,000 of competitive external funding to support outreach efforts in northwest Louisiana[†].

INTRODUCING CAPTAIN FIT

In 2014/2015, we connected with the Department of Pediatrics, a local art major from Louisiana State University-Shreveport, and the National Network of Libraries of Medicine South Central Region to produce an educational comic book aimed at reducing obesity in children.



Four health sciences library faculty received a Health Literacy Award from the National Network of Libraries of Medicine, South Central Region.

The funds were used to create a health-focused comic book, *The Amazing Captain Fit*, aimed at encouraging physical activity and preventing obesity in children ages 4-8.

Print versions of *Captain Fit* were distributed through the campus Reach Out and Read program, local public libraries, and Excalibur, the local comic book shop. The development and publication of *Captain Fit* was covered by major news outlets in northwest

Louisiana. The project team also exhibited *Captain Fit* at the first Louisiana Comic-Con in Bossier City in February 2015, and at the Shreve Memorial Library Author Fair and Comic Fest in June 2015.

The Amazing Captain Fit! Adventures in Staying Active and Being Healthy was the product of many collaborators.

CELEBRATING CAMPUS ARTISTS

We connected with artists in the LSU Health Shreveport and University Health populations and offered them a venue for sharing their works.

The Library collaborated to host two exhibits of talented campus artists.

With Medical Communications, the Library hosted the 3rd Annual *Art from the Heart*, March 16 through May 31, 2015. *Art from the Heart* showcased the artistic talents of LSU Health Shreveport and University Health students and employees. Artwork on display was from a wide variety of mediums. A reception on March 19, 2015, provided an opportunity for the campus to meet the artists.
