### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Dr. Beresford shared with the Board that he was honored to attend the Guru Vandana event at Prairie Trace Elementary on May 4th. He thanked the Hindu Swayamsevak Sang for organizing such a beautiful event and sharing their culture with our educators. Guru Vandana means "Reverence for the Teacher" and it is an opportunity for a student to express his or her gratitude to a teacher who imparts knowledge and wisdom.
- Dr. Beresford stated that he attended Clay Middle School's annual Dance Marathon. Students raised \$9580 for Riley Children's Hospital, setting a new state and national record for the amount of money raised by a middle school. Dr. Beresford also expressed his appreciation for the high school students who attended and helped lead the Clay Middle School students through different dance routines.
- Dr. Beresford congratulated Associate Superintendent of Business Affairs, Roger McMichael and his team for their work and development of the CCS Wellness Center. Dr. Beresford shared with the Board that the CCS Wellness Center received national recognition at the World Health Care Congress Summit. Carmel Clay Schools was the only school district in the country to receive this recognition.
- Dr. Beresford shared with the Board that he attended the CHS Philharmonic & Symphony Orchestra at the Palladium. He was impressed with the talent of all the students and enjoyed hearing the collaborative pieces with CHS United Sound who played "Somewhere Over the Rainbow." Dr. Beresford also commended CHS student Selin Oh on her cello performance of "Kol Nidrei."
- Dr. Beresford congratulated the CHS Unified Track Team and the CHS Boys Track Team for winning the MIC Championship. He also shared that the CHS Boys Track Team were named IHSAA Sectional Champions.
- Dr. Beresford congratulated the CHS Science Bowl Team on placing 5th in the nation at the competition held in Washington, D.C. He shared with the CCS School Board that one science bowl teammate, Kevin Liu, was named to the U.S. Physics team. Kevin will now attend training camp to compete at the International Physics Competition in Israel.
- Dr. Beresford reminded the community that the Pack the Cruiser event will be held on June 1st, 2019 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m at two Kroger locations (Rangeline Rd. & Michigan Rd.). The event will kick-off the CYAP's Summer Meals Program that helps support our CCS students. The program will provide an each family in need five healthy breakfasts and lunches for the 11 weeks of summer break. Dr. Beresford also thanked the Carmel Police Department for their annual partnership with the event.
- Dr. Beresford shared with the Board his "Bellringer," which he called "Fantastic Friday." He shared that the day began with recognizing 20 CCS educators and staff members for their years of service at the Retirement Breakfast. He mentioned that all of the retirees in the room that morning had a combined 757 years of experience working in education! Dr. Beresford then shared that he went to West Clay to see young CCS entrepreneurs in action during Lemonade Day! He enjoyed some very sweet lemonade while supporting a great cause. To cap off the Friday excitement, he shared that he had the opportunity to attend and wave the checkered flag at the Woodbrook Elementary Kindy500! He cheered on 78 kindergarten students alongside school staff, students, parents and even a few 500 Festival Princesses.

#### SCHOOL BOARD REPORTS

Board Member Mrs. Spanenberg provided a legislative update: She stated that 52 new laws were passed that related to education, school governance or child related programs and services. She thanked several CCS administrators and CCHA for their expertise and support for various legislative bills. She stated there was a significant surprise that surfaced after the legislative session that pertained to teacher professional growth points (PGP), found in HB1002, Career and Technical Education. She stated that ISTA and the IDOE are working through how this impacts teacher license renewals. CCS will work with the Carmel Teacher's Association to look for ways to deliver PGP opportunities and will offer guidance as it becomes available. Mrs. Spanenberg shared that HB1001 added 763 million dollars in "new money" for education over the next two years. Mrs. Spanenburg mentioned that SB127 was passed which now allows schools to have a school safety referendum.
