

SCHOOL BOARD COMMITTEES AND REPRESENTATIVES

To conduct some of the business of the school district, the School Board will appoint its members to committees or to serve as School Board representatives. School Board members who are not assigned as members of a given committee or are not appointed as a School Board representative may attend a meeting just as any other person, but does not necessarily represent the School Board.

School Board Committees

1. All committee meetings are legally posted, open to the public, and held at a public place according to School Board policy.
2. Committees will make periodic reports and give recommendations to the School Board.
3. Standing committees will be appointed for one-year terms by the School Board at the organizational meeting.
4. On occasion, ad hoc committees will be appointed by the School Board for a specific purpose, case, or situation. Ad hoc committees are advisory to the School Board and serve for a defined period of time.
5. Final decisions on committee recommendations will be made by the full School Board.

School Board Representatives

1. Committee representatives may not act as school employees or act with any more authority than is authorized by the full School Board.
2. School Board representatives to district committees or organizations will be appointed for one-year terms by the School Board at the organizational meeting.
3. On occasion, School Board members may be appointed to represent the School Board for a specific purpose, case, or situation.
4. Representatives will make periodic reports and give recommendations to the School Board.
