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Living at SSFS

Students who board at SSFS have an exceptional opportunity to extend their learning experience beyond the classroom to one of the nation's most vibrant cities and its surrounding region. The campus is remarkably well situated: it occupies 140 peaceful, rural acres in Sandy Spring, Maryland, yet is only 15 miles from Washington, DC.

Boarders are an integral part of the School's safe, close-knit community. As part of their residential experience, they put Quaker values in practice, cultivating respect and consideration for others, acting with integrity, and developing responsibility. Whether living in the campus residences or participating in a host family program, students build lifelong relationships with peers and faculty, gain rich understanding of people from diverse backgrounds, and develop valuable independent living skills that prepare them for college and the wider world.

In the Dorm*

Our dorm's 60 Upper School students and three resident faculty and staff create a rich and supportive environment for community life. The dorm is divided into "family groups" headed by a dorm staff member, who provides individual attention and care to the students. Students may receive academic help from teachers in the afternoons, and boarders attend student-proctored study halls on Sunday through Thursday evenings. Sunday night meetings keep the dorm community cohesive and informed of events and needs as they arise.

*Both five- and seven-day boarding options are available: five-day boarding students return home after classes on Friday and arrive back at school on Sunday evening, while seven-day boarders participate in a variety of weekend activities led by dorm staff.

Host Family Programs




