10th graders will take the PSAT 10 in April at school on a weekday. The PSAT 10 is a practice SAT designed for sophomores. More information will follow later in the year. No other testing is recommended and test preparation is not necessary.

IB Requirements:

10th grade students begin selecting IB courses during the second semester of this year. Sophomores will work on their Personal Projects in their MYP Product Team class during the first semester. Please be sure to attend the IB Information Night in March.
