Beyond her subject area assignments as Publication sponsor of the Quarry Magazine, Inkspot, Junior Achievement, and Future Teachers of America she was also actively assisting with the GAA (Girls Athletic Association) program. Here she volunteered her time skiing in Galena, hiking the Keepataw Trail, spending time with overnight gym nights, and helping with the Annual Gym Show that featured student gymnastics and skits.

As most first year teachers can attest to the first year of teaching can be an eye opener as students challenge the new teacher in many ways. Judy's favorite memory was when her Senior students assisted her with the homecoming bonfire by bringing in wood with nails still inserted... a Big Oops and the end of her Homecoming Bonfire experience. Going forward in other areas were pleasant memories of the Greek Plays where students learned to build scenery, make costumes, and memorize lines for their productions.

Reflecting over a span of 40 + years Judy reminisces at the many changes the decades have brought forth. The first 20 years air conditioning was obsolete, lessons were typed up on a typewriter, copies were made from a ditto machine upgraded to the first round of bulky Xerox machines. Grade cards were handed out, and attendance was written on paper and hung outside the classroom door for pick up. Other memories such as when the community library shared the facility, and volunteering for after school activities with little or no extra incentive except it was a part of being a teacher and providing opportunities for kids. As time continued the conveniences of air conditioning, better copying method's, and the world of computers arrived. Attendance, lesson planning, and grading became electronic and online, and continued to change daily. Education is a very different world from 40 years ago.

Family has and is an integral part of Judy's past and present. In the present she has experienced the joy of her nephew who has cerebral palsy getting cured of throat cancer. He has regained his laughter, the ability to communicate, and eat his favorite food "ice cream". He is the love of the family as his story has created an appreciation for the simple joys of life. They have found the goodness of everyday entertainment with the modern assistance of wheelchair accessible places together.

Judy has travelled over the years with her fondness memory being ringing in the New Year of 2000 in the City of Lights Paris, France. She has enjoyed for many years driving the golf cart at Cog Hill, and enjoys the pastime of fishing. Her travel bug is still alive and well should opportunity arise.

Judy has been a mentor for many of us over the years to learn from, and a good colleague and friend to all. Thanks Judy for sharing a bit of your past and present with us.
