
National Blue Ribbon Award

Less than one-half of one percent of the nation's schools have been honored as 2017 National Blue Ribbon Schools. Lemont H.S. is one of 25 schools from Illinois and one of just two Illinois public high schools to earn the honor this year (Neuqua Valley H.S. in Naperville being the second). These are the first traditional public high schools since 2010 to reach this honor.

The National Blue Ribbon Schools Program began in 1982. This program honors schools where students achieve very high learning standards. Exemplary High Performing Schools are among their state's highest performing schools as measured by their progress in closing achievement gaps between a school's subgroups and all students over the past 5 years.

To earn the Exemplary High Performing Schools designation, schools must achieve in the top 15% of all schools in the state when ranked by student performance on the most recently administered English language arts and math state assessments or by student performance on state assessments in combination with other student performance measures such as attendance and/or graduation rates.

CONGRATULATIONS TO THE 2018 ALUMNI HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES



On Saturday, March 3, Lemont High School welcomed its fourth class of Alumni Hall of Fame inductees. The Hall of Fame honorees were **Kenneth Novak '69**, **George Rimbo '87** and **Dr. Donald Weber '59**.

KENNETH NOVAK '69 Described as unassuming and kind, Kenneth Novak has dedicated nearly 50 years to the community he loves and does whatever he can to make Lemont a place people are proud to call home. Kenneth served for more than 30 years at the Lemont Park District, retiring as the Superintendent of Parks and Risk Manager. He was named the South Suburban Park & Recreation Professional Association "Park Professional of the Year" in 1992. His service to the Lions Club may be unparalleled in the Lemont community. Named the Lemont "Lion of the Year" multiple times, he served as President of the Lemont Lions Club, District Governor of Lions District 1-B, and President of the Lions of Illinois Foundation. Kenneth has found additional ways to impact the community, including a 10-year stint on the District 113A Board of Education and as a Lemont Area Historical Society board member. It's no surprise that Kenneth was cited as Lemont's 1994 "Citizen of the Year."

GEORGE RIMBO '87 George Rimbo has been a pillar of the Lemont community for decades, serving his community with enthusiasm and integrity. A three-sport high school athlete, George was captain of the football team and earned the Sons of the American Revolution Award as a senior. After beginning as a part-time fireman in 1988, George steadily climbed the ranks in the Lemont Fire Protection District before being selected to serve as fire chief in 2013. A member of the Illinois Association of Fire Chiefs, George served as a member of the District 113A Board of Education from 1993-99, and as a member of the Lemont High School District 210 Board of Education from 2009-13. He has been active in several service organizations, holding roles as a Cub master for Cub Scout Pack #249, as a football coach with the Lemont Hornets, and as a travel baseball coach with the Lemont Indians. George has lived a life centered around his family, his community, and fire service.

DR. DONALD WEBER '59 Few people have had as dynamic of a relationship with Lemont High School as Dr. Donald Weber. Just 20 years after graduation, he returned to his alma mater as its superintendent, holding that position from 1979-85. He served in the same capacity at Lockport High School District 205 (1985-92) and Naperville Community Unit School District 203 (1992-2003). From there, Dr. Weber moved on to PMA Financial Network, leading the effort to introduce a newly created financial planning program to Illinois school districts; one district that took advantage of this service was Lemont High School District 210. Dr. Weber currently serves as PMA's Senior Vice President for Corporate Relations. A member of many statewide organizations during his time as an educator, he received the Award of Excellence in School Administration from the Illinois State Board of Education.
