## Lemont H.S. Alumni Hall of Fame, Class of 2017 Inductee

"What a humbling experience and a proud moment for me to be recognized like this, growing up

#### and returning here to femont. Jhinking about it still brings tears to my eyes."

As a teacher, coach, administrator and community member, Al has had a 50+ year relationship with Lemont. He came to Lemont H.S. after spending 4 years in his first teaching job in the Pittsville school system in Wisconsin. He began his career teaching History and Geography and his inaugural coaching career started in their wrestling program. On a trip home he made a visit to one of his former teachers, John Jones, at the high school to say Hi. John announced that Lemont was in need of a wrestling coach. Al credits John and Superintendent Ed Bossert with giving him the opportunity to return to Lemont as a faculty member. Thirty–two years later he retired from LHS with a head coaching resume of Cross Country, Wrestling, Baseball, and Girls Volleyball in addition to serving as Athletic Director for 10 years. Al was the first former student to be hired as a member of the Lemont faculty. He was required to go back to school and pick up credit in Driver's Education and the rest is history. He remembers working with his former instructors Bill Ryan, Marie Glass, Mike Galati, and John Jones. Respect was high and he could never find himself calling any of them anything but Mr. or Miss. Coming back to teach at his alma mater was a very memorable time and experience for him. A gratifying moment he remembers is when his wrestling team won their first regional, providing the athletes an opportunity to compete downstate. Getting kids to work to their potential was a major goal of Al's and he found it highly satisfying when they did so. He saw Lemont H.S. as a great place from a students point of view, and an awesome place to work as an adult. He thought his family lucky to be able to share the Lemont experience, as his son, daughter, and his grandchildren were also students at LHS.

As Athletic Director he was instrumental in supporting the girls' sport programs, helping them move forward in competition and in the expectations of Title IX. Al served the community of Lemont through 50 years of volunteering as a member of the Lions Club, who provided scholarship opportunities to LHS students. Al also served on the Lemont Library and Lemont-Bromberek School District 113A Boards. He officiated youth sports, served as an auxiliary Lemont police officer for 20 years, was a Lemont Jaycee, and drove for the Gorski Bus Company in his spare time. He still finds time to assist in the press box at home football games in between travelling in and out of the country with his wife Cele. We congratulate our colleague Al on this honor!

#### **2017 LHS ALUMNI HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES**

MARY LOU CARLSON '71— Mary Lou Carlson has committed her life to making significant contributions at home and abroad through her extensive knowledge of agricultural economy. An Agriculture Advisor at the University of Illinois for 20 years, she also served as an instructor and researcher at Penn State University. Mary Lou managed international agriculture programs while working for the United States Agency of International Development (USAID) from 2004-11, and now works as a Senior International Program Specialist at the United States Department of Agriculture, directing international programs focused on food security and food safety. She has received numerous accolades for her work, including an Exceptional Team Award for a USAID mission to Mali in 2008, an Action Award for a

USAID mission to Afghanistan in 2011, and a Meritorious Honor Award from the U.S. Embassy in Afghanistan in 2012. Mary Lou also has been a Team Lead with the Peace Corps.

**NORMA (LANDGREN) JOHNSON '38**— A pillar of the Lemont community for nearly 100 years, Norma (Landgren) Johnson has been proud to call Lemont her life-long home. Living by her motto - "Family First" - Norma has dedicated herself to serving Lemont's schools, her church, and the community as a whole. As her children moved from activity to activity, she moved with them. Along the way, Norma was a Cub Scout den mother, a Girl Scout chairperson, and President of the Lemont Band Boosters. A member of Lemont's Planning Commission for 12 years, she served on the Lemont Library board and was President of the Lemont Area Historical Society. A vital member of Bethany Lutheran Church, Norma played as an accompanist for Lemont band students and read to second graders at Oakwood School. She was selected as the Grand Marshal for the 1992 Keepataw Days parade, and was tabbed as 1995's "Citizen of the Year" by the Lemont Chamber of Commerce.
