Scholarship Bulletin—Class Of 2020

Throughout the academic school year, local, state and federal organizations or agencies provide the opportunity for graduating seniors planning on pursuing post-high school education to apply for scholarships. Although many have financial need as part of their criteria, they all are looking to reward students for personal or academic achievements and/or encourage them to pursue a certain career or degree program.

SPECIAL NOTE: This bulletin will not address the financial aid process which is totally based on need. That process and appropriate forms will be handled through classroom presentations to seniors, newsletters and a special evening program for parents in December.

This bulletin is designed to be a guide for seniors and their parents/guardians for the scholarships that are available to seniors at Lyme/Old Lyme High School. Please read through the various scholarships and make note of the ones that would seem appropriate for you.

The danger of compiling a guide for scholarships at the beginning of a year is that **frequently application deadlines change or scholarships are added or dropped**. Updates will be made to this Bulletin through the Region 18 website (www.region18.org) on the high school counseling department page under the “Financial Aid and Scholarship Information” link.

Stop in the Counseling Office a month before the stated deadline for applications and/or more information.

The Counseling Office will supply a high school transcript for a scholarship when requested by the student. **Please expect a reasonable turn-around time upon request (approximately 7-10 school days)**. Students are responsible for mailing their scholarship application materials, including transcript, unless the instructions specifically state that the Counseling Office should mail the completed application packet.

MacCurdy-Salisbury Educ. Foundation, Old Lyme The Brevillier/Bruestle Fund, Lyme

The MacCurdy-Salisbury Educational Foundation, founded in 1893, was established to serve the purpose of education in the Town of Old Lyme. One of these purposes is awarding of scholarships to students residing in Old Lyme, who are enrolled in institutions of learning beyond high school. The Brevillier and Bruestle Funds were established to aid residents of the Town of Lyme. These awards are grant-in-aid, based on both need and merit; they are not automatically assigned for high scholastic attainment per se. Grants are paid to students not to institutions.

Eligibility: Applicants may be considered for scholarship awards who are:

1. Bona fide residents of the Town of Old Lyme or Lyme, Connecticut,
2. Recent graduates of high school or equivalent, and
3. Candidates for further education beyond the high school level.

Qualifications: In making its selection from among eligible applicants, the Foundation will give consideration to:

1. The student's scholastic performance and personal record at high school as indicated by school reports, and
2. The student's financial need as judged by the Foundation pursuant to a recommendation by the Foundation's Financial Aid Officer.

Any senior going on to post-high school education who feels they need some financial assistance should consider applying to the MacCurdy-Salisbury Foundation. Last year, awards ranged between \$200 and \$3,000. The awards are grants and are paid directly to the student--half for the first semester and half for the second. **The awards are renewable.**

Applications and brochures will be made available each year in the Counseling Office. Most families fill out the application in January or February. A short financial needs form and a copy of the family's IRS 1040 will be required. **The application deadline was May 4 in 2019. Please check in the Spring of 2020 for the updated deadline.** Complete instructions for applying for the scholarship are included with the application.

CHET ADVANCE SCHOLARSHIP—The Connecticut Higher Education Trust (CHET) is sponsoring a scholarship opportunity for high school freshmen and high school seniors. Amounts up to \$2,500 will be awarded to up to 100 freshmen and 100 seniors in the State of Connecticut to be used towards tuition, fees, books, supplies and other qualified educational expenses. CONNECTICUT/UNITED STATES JUNIOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP—Two scholarships are awarded to high school seniors planning to further their education at an accredited institution of higher learning. The two winners will have their applications forwarded to the U.S. Senate Foundation for further consideration for awards. **Deadline: January 11**

FIRST SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES—Over 90 colleges and universities, professional association and corporations from the US and Canada provide 450 scholarship opportunities valued at nearly \$9 million to FIRST high school students. Scholarship amounts and application deadlines vary. Up to date lists of scholarships available at www.usfirst.org **Various Deadlines**

MENSA FOUNDATION—Awards of \$300 locally and \$1,000 nationally are awarded based on an essay of fewer than 550 words, which describes the applicant's career, vocational, or academic goal for which assistance is sought. Applicants do not need to be members of Mensa nor eligible for membership. Not need based, and no minimum GPA requirement. **Deadline: January 15**

PRUDENTIAL SPIRIT OF THE COMMUNITY AWARDS—Honoring Middle and High School students for volunteer service in their communities. Applicants must be enrolled in grades 5-12 and describe a volunteer community service activity performed at least in part after September 1, 2006. See application for further details. LOLHS's committee will select one candidate to send to state-level judging. **Deadline For Returning Applications To Counseling Office: November 1**

RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE LOCAL CHAPTER SCHOLARSHIPS—Seniors who are eligible to attend a two- or four-year college, university or vocational/technical school with a complete course of study may apply for a maximum of one of the following four scholarships, **deadline for all is January 21**

- 1) **RMHC/ASIA:** Applicant must have at least one parent of Asian-Pacific heritage;
- 2) **RMHC/Future Achievers:** Applicant must have at least one parent of African American or Black Caribbean heritage;
- 3) **RMHC/HACER:** Applicant must have at least one parent of Hispanic heritage; or
- 4) **RMHC/Scholars:** All students are eligible to apply regardless of race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, gender, disability or national origin.

WESTBROOK ELKS-MOST VALUABLE STUDENT—Nominees are eligible for state and local competition. Scholarship awarded for academic achievement, extra-curricular activities, athletics and community affairs. **Deadline: November 30**

AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF FAMILY & CONSUMER SCIENCES: CONNECTICUT AFFILIATE—A \$500 scholarship awarded to 2 graduating seniors planning to major in Family & Consumer Sciences or a related field, e.g. Child or Family Development, Fashion Design, Dietetics, Clothing & Textiles, Home & Living Design, Hotel/Restaurant Management, Cons. & Resource Management. **Deadline: March 15**

AMERICAN CHEMICAL SOCIETY—For college-bound seniors of African-American, Hispanic/Latino or Native American descent; must be high achievers in chemistry or science and able to demonstrate financial need. **Deadline: March 1**

ASSOCIATION OF GENERAL CONTRACTORS OF CONN—Applicants must be planning to enter a 4-year building technology or civil engineering program or entering a 2-year technical school with a construction course of study with the intent of entering a 4-year college. **Deadline: February 28**

ASSOCIATION OF RETIRED TEACHERS OF CONNECTICUT GLENN MOON SCHOLARSHIP—For seniors who are seriously pursuing a teaching career. 21,000 (1); \$1500 (2). **Deadline: March 30**

THE BLACK ENGINEERING COUNCIL OF ELECTRIC BOAT SCHOLARSHIP—New London County High School Seniors of African-American descent who have been accepted to a college or university for the fall after graduation and who have a minimum GPA of 2.5 are eligible to apply. Two winners will be selected and the amount of each scholarship may vary each year, but a total of approximately \$4,500 will be awarded. **Deadline: March 1**

WILLIAM H. CHAPMAN FOUNDATION—Provides financial assistance to scholars of New London County, CT for post secondary education in both academics and the trades. Awards range from \$500 to \$2,500 and are renewable for up to four years. Awards are based on academic achievement and financial need. Student must be planning to major in a career that provides emotional or medical support for families. CONNECTICUT SPORTS WRITERS' ALLIANCE—Awarded to seniors planning to major in Print (Sports) Journalism at a 4-year college. Web site: www.ctsportswriters.org . **Deadline: February 22**

CONNECTICUT STATE USBC (BOWLING ASSOCIATION)—For male or female high school seniors who are the son, daughter, granddaughter or grandson of a currently sanctioned member of the Connecticut State Bowling Association. **Deadline: March 15**

CONNECTICUT TOURISM INDUSTRY SCHOLARSHIP—For graduating seniors of Connecticut high schools who plan to pursue post-secondary education in the field of Tourism or Hospitality. **Deadline: March 30**

CONNECTICUT WATER WORKS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP—The Connecticut Water Works Association and the Connecticut Section of the American Water Works have established a scholarship for eligible high school seniors who plan to pursue an approved course of study at an accredited higher education institution directly related to environmental science, water resources, public health or the water industry. Students must have a GPA of at least 3.0. **Deadline: March 15.**

SCOTT MARSH CORY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP—Accepted at and planning to attend an accredited four year college or university in the fall semester immediately after graduation. The goal of the scholarship committee is to reward a "well-rounded" student who has demonstrated humanistic concerns, sense of community and school service, and an appreciation of others. Applicants should have a cumulative "B" average and have participated on at least one athletic team. \$1,000 **Deadline: April 15 (LOL)**

DELTA KAPPA GAMMA SOCIETY INTERNATIONAL: ETA CHAPTER (THE MARY E. TYTLA SCHOLARSHIP)—Awarded to two female high school seniors accepted at accredited institutions of higher learning and planning to major in education or related fields of study. **Deadline: April 7**

DELTA KAPPA GAMMA SOCIETY INTERNATIONAL (THE ELIZABETH SONIER GRANT)—Awarded to a senior pursuing a degree in music education. A \$750, renewable grant. **Deadline: March 31**

DELTA KAPPA GAMMA SOCIETY INTERNATIONAL (THE HANNAH GRISWOLD GRANT)—Awarded to a senior minority student pursuing a degree in education. A \$750, renewable grant. **Deadline: March 31**

DELTA KAPPA GAMMA SOCIETY INTERNATIONAL (THE LEE FORMICA GRANT)—Awarded to a senior student entering a planned program for teaching communications, which includes, but is not limited to, English, reading, computer graphics, journalism and ESL. A \$500 grant. **Deadline: March 31**

DOMINION NUCLEAR CT ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP—Scholarship will pay for tuition, fees and books at Three Rivers Community Technical College for a student to receive a two-year Associate in Science Degree in Nuclear Engineering Technology. EASTERN CT USBC ASSOCIATION SCHOLAR OF THE YEAR—Applicants shall be currently certified members of the Eastern Connecticut USBC Association and currently bowling in a Youth League in one of the bowling centers governed by the Eastern CT USBC Association OR applicant's mother or father is a certified member of the Eastern Connecticut USBC Association and currently bowling in a league in one of the bowling centers governed by the Eastern CT USBC Association. Student applicants must have a 3.0 GPA or greater, intend to pursue a degree in a STEM field of study and have been accepted to an accredited college or university. **Deadline: April 12 (received by)**

FRIENDS OF MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP—Two \$500 scholarship awarded to students who have demonstrated excellence in the LOLHS music program and challenged themselves academically. GEORGE COLEMAN SCHOLARSHIP—Each year, the New England Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers awards scholarships to three (3) high school graduates who will be enrolling in a NEACRAO member institution for the fall semester of that year. Each high school graduate who is selected is awarded \$2,000. Each recipient of the scholarship is selected from candidates who are recommended by New England secondary school guidance professionals. **Deadline: March 15**

HARTFORD GAY AND LESBIAN HEALTH COLLECTIVE SCHOLARSHIP—For Connecticut resident high school seniors who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender, or come from an LGBT family, or consider themselves an ally of the LGBT community. **Deadline: April 15**

JOE LIEBERMAN CONNECTICUT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM—U.S. Senator Joe Lieberman, serving 1989-2013, has established the Joe Lieberman Connecticut Scholarship Fund to assist outstanding high school seniors from Connecticut who plan to continue their education in college or vocational school programs. Generous donations to the fund support the renewable \$1,500 scholarships which are awarded for full-time study at an accredited institution of the student's choice. **Deadline: April 1**

KEY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP—Awarded to Key Club members. For additional info, go to www.keyclub.org. **Deadline: March 1 for the New England District Scholarship application; Various deadlines for other Key Club-related scholarships**

KIWANIS CLUB OF NEW LONDON N. B. KING SCHOLARSHIP—Awarded to seniors at New London, Waterford, East Lyme, St. Bernard's, Lyme-Old Lyme or Grasso Tech High Schools, also college students or returning-to-college students. **Deadline: April 30**

KLINE FAMILY COMMUNITY SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP—An award of at least \$250.00 to senior who plans to attend UCONN and has demonstrated a record of community service. **Deadline April 25**

ALAN MCLEAN KYLE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP—Awarded to a graduating senior who plans to major in any field of engineering. \$500. **Deadline: April 15 (LOL)**

LYME-OLD LYME CHAMBER OF COMMERCE BUSINESS LEADERSHIP AWARD—A \$1,000 award will be given to a graduating senior of the Lyme-Old Lyme High School who has demonstrated achievement in economics, business, technology or a closely related area who plans to pursue a career in business studies or a related field. Student shall have demonstrated ability to balance and integrate academics with community service and his or her entrepreneurial skills. **Deadline: April 27**

LYME-OLD LYME CHAMBER OF COMMERCE SCHOLARSHIP FOR PROMIS & ACHIEVEMENT IN THE ARTS—For residents of Lyme or Old Lyme, this senior award is given to a student who is taking or has taken an Advanced Placement (AP) art course and who has demonstrated achievement in the fine arts. Applicants must be entering college in the fall to pursue a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree at an accredited art school or college. **Deadline: April 27**

LYME-OLD LYME JUNIOR WOMENS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP—Two \$1,000.00 scholarships awarded to a graduating seniors with a G.P.A. of 75 or above and based on demonstration of service to the community. **Deadline: April 15 (LOL)**

LYME/OLD LYME LIONS CLUB SCHOLARSHIPS—**Deadline: April 15**

- 1) **HAROLD J. NICKERSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**—A scholarship awarded based on a combination of scholastic and athletic achievement. **(LOL)**
- 2) **RALPH P. KEHOE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**—Any graduating senior who has been accepted as a full-time student at a post high school accredited institution, including one year non-degree programs, may apply. All students who feel they have a solid academic record and have been involved in some community and/or school activities are highly encouraged to apply. **(LOL)**

NATHAN HALE BRANCH OF THE CONNECTICUT SOCIETY OF THE SONS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION: 700-1000 word essay contest for graduating seniors. Original researched and proven essay which shall deal with an event, person, philosophy, or ideal associated with the American Revolution, the Declaration of Independence, or the framing of the United States Constitution. Connecticut related topic preferred but not required. See application for details. **Deadline: March 31.**

NEW ENGLAND CHAPTER-NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WATER COMPANIES (NENAWC)—Scholarship awarded to graduating high school seniors in CT, MA, ME, NH and RI with a minimum 3.0 GPA. Preference will be given to applicants who are actively pursuing an approved course of study at an accredited higher education institution directly related to drinking water, water engineering, environmental studies or waste water. **Deadline: March 15**

NEW ENGLAND INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY CONTEST / SCHOLARSHIP—Scholarship contest offered to all high school juniors and seniors planning to attend NEIT. Students will submit a 500-700 word essay answering a specific question regarding the effects of modern technology on U.S. policies and the quality of our lives. The top three winning students will be recognized with tuition scholarships, applied to offset tuition if enrolled in a full time Associate's Degree program at NEIT. First place will be awarded a \$2,000.00 tuition scholarship, second place \$1,500.00 and third place \$ 1,000.00. **Deadline is April 17 (received by date)**

NEW LONDON COUNTY BAR ASSOCIATION—For graduating seniors in New London County who plan to pursue a career in the law. This is a one-time scholarship in the amount of \$1,000. **Deadline: April 15**
