

**LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS**  
**Application Scholarships Offered by Local Organizations**

**4/7 FRIENDS OF MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP**—For participants in LOLHS music program—scholarships are awarded to students who have demonstrated excellence in the LOLHS music program and challenged themselves academically. Community service will be considered. Preference given to students who will be continuing music studies as a major or elective in college.

**4/15 LYME-OLD LYME LIONS CLUB**—Three \$1,500 awards given in memory of four past members of the lions club: Harold Nickerson, Ralph Kehoe, Lew Krause and Donald McCue. Community service is the criteria valued above any other in awarding these scholarships. Each applicant must write an essay entitled “What I Have Done For My Community.”

**4/15 OLD LYME HISTORICAL SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP**—For LOLHS seniors accepted at and planning to attend an accredited college or university and major in any field of History.

**4/15 ALAN MCLEAN KYLE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**—Awarded to a graduating senior who plans to major in any field of engineering. \$500.

**4/15 DUCK RIVER GARDEN CLUB**—Awarded to one college bound senior planning on majoring in one of the agricultural or environmental fields, i.e. horticulture, conservation, forestry, landscape design, botany, agriculture, environmental studies/science, etc. Up to \$1,000

**4/15 EVERETTE F. “RED” LATOURETTE SCHOLARSHIP**—Awards two graduating high school seniors residing in Lyme or Old Lyme, with G.P.A of 85 or higher, active in community service, and must have participated in Little League at any level (softball, t-ball, baseball, coach, umpire), and be admitted to an accredited institution of higher learning.

**4/15 LYME-OLD LYME JUNIOR WOMENS’ CLUB**—Two \$1000 scholarships awarded to graduating seniors with a G.P.A. of 75 or above and based on demonstration of service to the community.

**4/15 SCOTT MARSH CORY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**—For seniors accepted at and planning to attend an accredited four year college or university in the fall semester immediately after graduation. The goal of the scholarship committee is to reward a "well-rounded" student who has demonstrated humanistic concerns, sense of community and school service, and an appreciation of others. Applicants should have a cumulative "B" average and have participated on at least one athletic team. \$1,000

**4/15 YOUTH ADVISORY COUNCIL—COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP**

**AWARD**—Two scholarships awarded to graduating seniors accepted into an accredited post secondary institution. Students must have demonstrated community involvement and leadership through service and volunteering. Applicants must have a cumulative average of 75 or higher.

**5/4 MACCURDY-SALISBURY EDUCATION FOUNDATION AND BREVILLIER**

**FUND**—Applicants may be considered for scholarship awards who are:

1. Bona fide residents of the town of Old Lyme or Lyme, Connecticut,
2. Recent graduates of high school or equivalent, and
3. Candidates for further education beyond the high school level.

**Qualifications:** in making its selection from among eligible applicants, the foundation will give consideration to the student's financial need as judged by the Foundation pursuant to a recommendation by the foundation's financial aid officer.

**5/8 CHRIST THE KING CHURCH-GRAVES MEMORIAL / LADIES GUILD**

**SCHOLARSHIPS**—Active participant of Christ The King Church in Old Lyme who will be attending a two or four-year college or technical school. Selection will be made on the type of service given to church, school, and community. Amount varies.
