

# Family Writing Connections

Grade 4 Unit 4: Bringing History to Life



# Overview:

Students will continue to strengthen their information writing skills as they explore the American Revolution. In addition, students will bridge reading and writing as they learn how to research informational texts in order to write a short book that includes an overview of the American Revolution, as well as a few chapters about a subtopic that may include other genres of writing, such as essays or narrative stories.

### In this unit, Students will:

- **Introduce** a topic and group related information
- **Develop** the topic, **elaborating** with some facts, definitions, and details
- **Organize** their writing in more sophisticated ways, such as including headings and subheadings
- Draw evidence from texts to support analysis, reflection, and research
- **Choose** a logical structure to help readers understand the most important information in their pieces
- **Incorporate** increasingly sophisticated transition words and phrases in a purposeful way
- **Clarify** and bring out the structure in their writing
- **Present** important information through the use of historical details, text features, and quotations

- **Create** text features that underscore the main message of a piece of writing
- **Decide** which vocabulary words to incorporate
- Generate life lessons from their topics
- Generate questions and then hypothesize and research answers to those questions
- Integrate information from texts in a way that feels purposeful and organic
- Edit their writing before publication with a focus on the unique way that historical writers use punctuation

• Encourage your child to research topics of interest related to the American Revolution, using the Newsela Text Set on the Revolutionary War and other sources, such as videos and websites.
