This is the LAST opportunity for you to register for Oklahoma's Promise. Please visit [www.okpromise.org](http://www.okpromise.org).
- Testing
  - The sophomore year is a very busy year for testing. All sophomores will take the PSAT in October and three MAP exams throughout the school year. It is very important to do your best as these scores help us determine course alignment and sequential course of study that is right for students. ALL students are strongly encouraged to access their KAHN Academy account to practice skills for the upcoming PSAT exam.

### Juniors-Class of 2021

- Testing
  - Juniors, the PSAT examination will be administered on October 30<sup>th</sup>. This is the qualifying year for National Merit status. You are strongly advised to log on to [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com) to review the preparation materials and use your KAHN academy and use your personalized tutorial for the upcoming PSAT exam.

- Juniors will also have 2 End of Instruction Examinations in April. It is very important that you prepare well during the school year in order to successfully complete these examinations as the results will be part of the student's official transcript and a necessary component of graduation.
- All juniors will take the FREE SAT during the school day, during Spring 2020. This is an eligible college reporting score.
- Juniors are also encouraged to take the ACT during the junior year. Please visit the ACT website to determine registration dates at [www.actstudent.org/start](http://www.actstudent.org/start). Fee waivers are available from your counselor for all Saturday national testing dates.

### Seniors-Class of 2020

- **\*\*\*Graduation Requirements\*\*\***
  - Foolproof/Personal Financial Literacy
    - This State of Oklahoma graduation requirement has to be satisfied by August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019. Students that are in jeopardy of not completing this requirement will not be able to pick up schedules, register for and/or participate in any senior related activity.   - CPR
    - Hands only adult CPR instruction is another graduation requirement. Students have two options; complete a CPR course on your own and submit a copy of your certificate to your counselor OR beginning in August visit the Edison webpage and sign up for one of our FREE sessions.

This is not a year for you to lessen the rigor in your class schedule. We are strongly encouraging all seniors to have registered for the ACT or SAT by September 2019. Additionally, we are recommending all students that are planning on attending college in the fall of 2020 to apply for admissions during the early action deadline. Many colleges/universities will begin accepting applications July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019.
