

# A Message from our **PASTOR**

On May 19, the Senior Class of 2019 gathered for their Baccalaureate Mass and Commencement ceremony. The graduates processed into church for the last time and celebrated the Mysteries of the Catholic faith at Mass. Following the liturgy, we gratefully acknowledged their accomplishments and conferred on them their diplomas. It was a beautiful time for us to be together. They are a wonderful class and good, young men and women. As our graduates move forward into their next life's journey, we pray that they will stay close to the Lord Jesus and always follow the promptings of the Holy Spirit. Congratulations DCHS Class of 2019!

As each graduation class moves on, another group of students enter the halls of Divine Child High School. It doesn't matter if we are moving on to college or entering the halls for the first day of high school, getting married or saying goodbye, change always brings excitement, anxiousness and, in some ways, a sense of loss. As you may or may not know, this past February, Archbishop Vigneron asked me to leave Divine Child Parish to become the pastor of St. Paul Parish in Grosse Pointe Farms, Michigan beginning July 1, 2019.

The twelve years here at Divine Child have been a blessing. Much has been accomplished, such as the construction of the Divine Child Alumni Athletic Complex, which includes a beautiful field house for practices, meetings and storage and an expanded, renovated concessions area. The west wing of the elementary school was renovated to create interior/exterior bathrooms, an updated locker room and meeting room. We established the Advancement Office in the west wing of the convent, renovated the science rooms in both schools, and gutted and updated the high school auditorium. We retiled floors, painted walls, and installed new lockers in the elementary and high schools. The student and faculty restrooms, and the libraries in both buildings, were redone as well. There is much more I could list; however, and most importantly, we renovated the high school chapel and made upgrades to the church. All of this does not even include the many very positive and creative changes to our academic curriculum and the Fine Arts and Theology departments. In one way or another, all these efforts ultimately enhance our ability to bring parishioners, parents, students, alumni and visitors into our buildings to encounter the Lord Jesus, for without the Lord, all our efforts are in vain. It is with prayer, sacrifice, generosity and faith that we are able to do all that we do. I believe the Lord has blessed us more than we can ever imagine, and I pray none of us ever take His generosity for granted.

I am very grateful to all of you who have supported, cared and prayed for me so that I could be a good shepherd in your midst. I am humbled that the Lord allowed me to be here at Divine Child for four years as an Associate Pastor, from 1992-1996, and then as Pastor from 2007-2019. You have blessed my life and have allowed me to grow closer to the Lord. There have been many joyous celebrations -- graduations, athletic victories, concert/choral achievements, academic/creative excellence and all-school liturgies. Most importantly, I have enjoyed celebrating the marriages and baptisms of children of alumni. There have also been very sad times due to tragedies, deaths, separations and loss of people's relationship with Jesus. Through all the joys and sorrows, I trusted in the Lord for his abiding presence and guidance. I am grateful the Lord has never let me down in his Providential care.

Also, for those who attended Divine Child Elementary School, I want to thank Sr. Cecilia Bondy, Principal of the elementary school, who is retiring in June after 50 years of service to Divine Child Parish and its schools. Mrs. Ann Marie Grabarkiewicz, who has been here for 28 years, is also retiring from her position as elementary school Assistant Principal. Your presence has helped us to see the face of God!

As I move on, please welcome our new pastor, Fr. Bob McCabe. He is a native of Allen Park, Michigan, but he is very familiar with our area. He lived in Dearborn for many years and was an Associate Pastor at Sacred Heart Parish several years ago. He is a wonderful, prayerful man. Please pray for him and give him a warm and wonderful Divine Child welcome!

I sincerely will miss being here. I trust in God's Providence knowing that He has plans for me as I begin a new chapter in my life as an Archdiocesan priest. Thank you all for everything!

#### GRADUATION: CONGRATS - CLASS OF 2019

199 students celebrated graduation on Sunday, May 19 with a baccalaureate Mass held in the Church of the Divine Child. This high performing class included 104 students who graduated with honors and took AP exams. This senior class also earned \$11,290,930 in scholarships, 76% of those being merit-based scholarships. Congratulations to Valedictorian Allan VanZandt '19 (right) and Salutatorian James Utley '19 (left). VanZandt and Utley will both be attending the University of Michigan-Ann Arbor in the fall.

#### **DIVINE CHILD ROBOTICS CLUB**

The Divine Child Technology and Robotics Club competed in the Square One Autonomous Innovative Vehicle Design Competition for the fifth year in May. This year we were awarded first place in Engineering and Craftsmanship. The challenge is to take a stock Power Wheels Jeep that would be driven by toddlers and turn it into an autonomous vehicle. Teams came from around Michigan and surrounding states to show off their work by completing a number of challenges. Students spend much of the school year learning about programming, electronics, and robotics. All of this culminates in a car that can drive by itself and respond appropriately to input received from its sensors.





#### DCHS FORENSICS TEAM 8-PEAT CHAMPIONS!

The 2019 Forensics Team members and coaches are very proud to be EIGHT-PEAT CLASS B M.I.F.A. STATE CHAMPIONS. Our team qualified for 26 State Finalist events with 36 Forensics Falcons competing in all 14 individual categories in Public Address and in the Oral Interpretation of Literature.



Six of our Forensics Falcons' events individually won 1st place State Championships, a rare and outstanding accomplishment achieved by only a very few high school teams, and only achieved once before by our 2008 DC Forensics Team. The Six 2019 Individual State Championship events include: Duo Interpretation – Sophia Mijat & Madelyne Charnley; 3 Peat Sales Champion – Jana Rida 2017, 2018, 2019; Oratory – Kelly Samulski; Back-to-Back Broadcasting Champion – Amal Elsaleh 2018, 2019; Storytelling – Nathan Garay; and Informative Speaking – Ella Hall. Mrs. Tar is completing 23 years at Divine Child as the head Forensics Team coach, and shared the position with Cameron Bonk `10, and Tricia Calka `11 this year. Assistant coaches of this Eight Peat Team include Mrs. Laura Miller, Fr. Matt Hood, faculty members Ms. Bernadette Bacero '08 and Ms. Rutkowski, and over a dozen additional Divine Child Forensics Team Alumni from the classes 2003 to 2018.

# SPRING MUSICAL: 42nd Second Street!



#### TEAM UPDATES

BOYS BASEBALL enjoyed a successful year winning the district championship, upsetting the #1 ranked team in division 2 in the preregional, and making it to the regional round as one of the last 16 teams remaining. The team was led by 1st team All-State catcher Kyle Gurney '19, Jacob Balash '19 and Ryan Zurenko '19. The team was very young (four sophomores and two freshman) and was led in pitching by starters Nate Raniszewski '20, Grant Reising '21 and Jack Zang '22, with Josh Fitzgerald '20 in the bullpen.

**BOYS BASKETBALL** (19-5) won District Champs and AA Co-Champs. They lost in the Regional Final to River Rouge, but beat Division 4 state champion Southfield Christian and Catholic Central in the regular season.

**GIRLS BASKETBALL** (14-10) finished third place in the CHSL Central Division, avenging two very close regular season losses to Mercy by beating them in the CHSL semi-finals to get back to Calihan Hall. The team also ranked as the CHSL Runner Up District Champions.

BOYS & GIRLS BOWLING had another incredible year growing to include a full JV and Varsity girls program as well as a JV-A/B and Varsity Boys program. The girls program, led by six seniors, won the regular season East Division Championship. The boys program lead by three seniors won the overall East Division Championship.

**COMPETITIVE CHEER** finished their season by finishing fourth in the state for Division 2 at the MHSAA State Championship and clinching the Catholic League title.


BOYS LACROSSE had a season of adversity, character building and commitment with a young, inexperienced team. After graduating 15 players in 2018, coaches rebuilt the Varsity roster and played against the top 20 teams. The players improved after every game learned to be a TEAM and strived to improve everyday.

GIRLS SOCCER (19-4-2) had an outstanding season, finishing second in the Catholic League's Division I. The team finished the season with a goal differential of +74 (94 goals for, 20 against), and was able to capture a District Championship prior to reaching its first Regional Championship appearance since 1997. The program is extremely grateful to graduates Cate Charron '19, Bridget Rogers '19, Rachel Toloday '19 and Marta Andreu '19.

**GIRLS SOFTBALL** won the District title, advancing to the Regional tournament, eventually losing to Ida High School. Congratulations to Sidney Croskey `20 who took home Honorable Mention All State bonces.

GIRLS TRACK AND FIELD won their 5th consecutive CHSL title by amassing 192 points to Macomb Lutheran North's 77 points. The team then sent 13 girls to the State Championships by winning the regional meet, which was held at Divine Child. At the MHSAA State Championships, Avery Budz `20 and Elena Welker `19 tied for 2nd in the High Jump. Welker took 4th in the Long Jump, while the team of Lily laquaniello '19, Macey Pappas `20, Ashley Avant `21 and Avery Budz `20 took 7th in the 4x400m relay. Elena Welker `19 set a new school record in the Long Jump with a distance of 17'7". Also, the 4x800m relay team of Lily laquaniello `19, Brooke Aho `20, Eliza Thayer `22, and Haley Aho `20 set a new CHSL record by recording a time of 9:48.32, breaking the old record of 9:49.79

BOYS TRACK AND FIELD had great success as they accomplished nearly every goal they set out to achieve. Dominated by mostly underclassmen, the Boys T&F team was one of the best in the entire region. They achieved big victories at the Mark Carpenter Invitational, the Wayne County Championships, the State Regional and the Catholic League Championship. At the Catholic League Championship, for the first time in history they became Back-to-Back Champions. They won the CHSL Championship by 36 points, something that is unheard of in the boy's championship. Our team also placed 4th in the Michigan High School Athletic Association State Championship, the highest place ever for a Divine Child boys track team.























**BOYS HOCKEY** celebrated 25 years of lacing up skates this year! The team welcomed 17 new players to its roster, witnessing plenty of growth during the season. Thanks to the more than 40 grads who played in our alumni game earlier this year!

GIRLS POM PON was led by two seniors, Mary Johnson `19 and Marina Traub `19. The team won the Catholic League and took second in high kick and runner up for the Class B State title.

**GIRLS TENNIS** won the Regional title for the first time in program history. The team advanced to the State Tournament in Novi, placing 20th.

BOYS GOLF took some large steps in the right direction in the 2019 season. The Varsity team had wins over St. Mary's (175 to 178) and Lutheran North (183 to 185). Going into the State Regional, the Varsity teams best 18-hole score was 354. At the Regional event the team carded a 340 and finished 4 strokes from making the State tournament as a team. We had one individual Mahmoud Saad `20 card a 73, which qualified him for the State tournament. He finished a respectable 23rd overall with rounds of 78 and 82. Coaches Fran DePlanche '91 and Ben Loiselle '92 are looking forward to the 2020 season with three returning varsity seniors.

GIRLS FIGURE SKATING team lead by coach and alumna, Leticia Romero `02 took 1st place in their district and finished 3rd place at the Michigan State High School championships. Way to finish the season strong!





#### **GIRLS LACROSSE CELEBRATES FIRST SEASON!**

Our new girls' lacrosse team took the field for the first time this March with 20 Varsity players and 18 Junior Varsity players. Despite being designated as a "club team," Assistant Athletic Director Ben Cronin was able to fill the team's schedule with games against MHSAA teams. Led by Varsity Coach Dave Medley and JV Coaches Gracie Savage and Chad Baugh, the girls competed with a ton of heart!

Our Varsity team made up of primarily juniors and seniors played against girls who had between 3-4 years of high school lacrosse experience. As a new sport, many of our team members were inexperienced, so coaches set out to teach players "the game" and ensure everyone had a blast.

But, the girls picked up the game quick. The JV team experienced its first victory on a lacrosse field early on, defeating Royal Oak High School's JV Lacrosse team. The Varsity team lost its first game to Bedford High School, but caught up a month later, totally dismantling the BHS team on their home turf. The season ended on a high note with the JV team posting seven victories and the Varisty team holding a 9-4-1 record.



#### It started with Blue Suede Shoes.

Matthew Chantelois '96 first impersonated Elvis Presley at a Divine Child High School dance in 1995. It wasn't long before his uncanny likeness in voice and appearance led him to go pro.

While in high school Chantelois, otherwise known as "King," (his stage name) worked at Lynch's costume shop in Dearborn where an Elvis jumpsuit was hanging in the costume shop. He knew he needed a costume for the school's Halloween dance so he purchased the jumpsuit and went to the dance as Elvis. At the dance, he sang "Blue Suede Shoes" and everyone told him how much he sounded like Elvis. Ms. Goode, a religion teacher at the time, told him he was very good and should look into Elvis impersonations. It wasn't long after that he started doing anniversary and birthday parties. Little did he know, 25 years, Elvis would be his career.

Chantelois always thought he would be a police officer. After high school, he attended Henry Ford Community College and then Eastern Michigan University with a plan to study criminal justice. While in college he continued impersonating Elvis. "I always wanted to become a cop, but I enjoyed playing Elvis so much and the calls kept coming in, that I soon realized there was real money doing it," said Chantelois. He decided to give up plans to be a cop and focus on Elvis impersonations.

In 1998, two years into college, CBS was hosting a contest in coordination with the Woodward Dream Cruise. The winner won a trip to Hawaii to compete in a solo show for two weeks against 25 other guys. He won! When he returned from the trip, he entered an international Elvis competition in Collingwood, Ontario, against 185 other Elvises. "About 80,000 people attended the event," Chantelois says.

He won again! He has since gone on to win over 30 Elvis contests.

In 1999, he started and founded the Michigan Elvis Fest located in Ypsilanti. To this day, it is the largest show of its kind in North America. Over 27,000 people attend. "The show itself has evolved into so much more than how it started. This event is my biggest accomplishment to date," stated Chantelois.

However, he thinks his biggest break came when his aunt, who supervised promotions for a pharmaceutical company, came up with a marketing idea for a heartburn drug based on the Elvis song "Heartbreak Hotel." Only this one was titled "Heartburn Hotel."



Chantelois and his wife Victoria welcomed their daughter, Ocean, in 2009.

Chantelois was hired to make a promotional tour of the country and appear as Elvis at physician events. "I would do a little skit for all the physicians who attended the conference."

Chantelois fondest memory of DC is spending time in the art room with Mr. Mike Foye '63 and Ms. Last. But nothing

compares to the many times Mr. Smetek, the dean of students, would hound him to cut his hair. "I knew my hair was too long, but I couldn't cut it. So one day, I finally bought Brylcreem to hold my hair down so he would lay off. I have so many great memories of my time at DC." He laughed saying, "many can't be shared!"

Since his love of music, impersonating Elvis and entertainment brought him much success, Chantelois started his own company called Matt King Entertainment (mattkingentertainment. com). It is a talent agency specializing in singing tribute artists and look alikes as well as DJ and emcee services. Aside, from Elvis, Chantelois himself portrays several other characters, including Joe Cocker, Waylon Jennings, Roy Orbison and Paul McCartney.

Chantelois currently resides in Mason, Michigan on 80 acres with his wife, Veronica and daughter, Ocean (10).

# My love of running started at Divine Child.

Coach Goepp was instrumental in creating a positive and nurturing environment that I would carry with me years and years later. The foundation of my passion for running, running friendships, and becoming a goal motivated individual were planted during my years as a Falcon!

After high school, my running journey continued as I was seeking moments of quiet and clarity. I used running during my college years, young professional time (ran my 1st marathon in Houston, TX when I had my first job as a Registered Dietitian and Matt Starosciak`91, my husband was in Law School) and as a new parent. I remember using a single, double, and even a triple jogger as a way to be able to run while my girls were little.

Then in 2006, Kristi (Homberger)
Elwart `91 and I decided to train and run
the Chicago marathon. We thought a
destination marathon would be motivation
to get into shape after 3 babies each.
After this event, I was definitely bit by the
marathon bug and had a goal to get faster.

I was able to use my love for running and my nutrition expertise to my advantage to get stronger and faster.

I ran the Boston Marathon in 2013, the year of the bombing. It was (and is) my marathon PR. It should have been such a great day for me. I had my sister's whole family, DeAnna (Pappas) McFetridge `88, my parents, and my oldest daughter in the grandstands at the finish line. I remember feeling so happy seeing them cheering in the bleachers (I had visualized the moment all through my training). I crossed the finish line with a 6-minute marathon PR and a negative split. I could not have felt better.... for about an hour. And then the bomb happened and everything changed.

I came back and ran the 2014 Boston Marathon. I qualified to run in the Elite Women's corral (as a masters runner) but that didn't seem to matter as much as I had two other missions that day. #1 to show that the running community is stronger than terrorism and #2 to thank the Boston Police (who lined every step of the course) and the Boston Marathon spectators who are always cheering for you rain, wind, snow, heat.

It was at this point I decided to start "running for a reason". In 2014 I registered to be a St. Jude Hero and run the 1/2 marathon for childhood cancer. After loving the feeling of running for others, I became a Rally runner. It was the best running decision I ever made.

Rally is an Atlanta-based foundation that raises money for childhood cancer research. In 2015, I raised 3K in honor of Peyton Green, a 3-year-old fighting Leukemia. I ran the 2015 Publix marathon in honor of her.

During this time as a Rally Athlete, I met another runner, Mark Myers, who was running for his 12-year-old daughter Kylie. As sad as sad can be, Kylie lost her cancer battle before the race. I told her Dad that I wanted to run Boston in her honor. So the following month, Kylie and I ran Boston. It wasn't my best time, but wearing her name and hearing the thousands of spectators

cheering, "go Kylie" was better than any time on a clock. After the race, I sent her family the medal as it really belonged to them

In 2017, I decided to take a different approach for childhood cancer. I didn't raise a ton of money, but I had a goal to raise awareness. I created "Grant's Web" in honor of a little guy who LOVED Spider man. Several of us Rally runners and advocates passed out bracelets to family and friends to wear on April 17, 2017 (Boston Marathon). On that marathon Monday, 100s of people were supporting Grant's Web!

I'm so thankful for my running journey. I'm grateful to Divine Child for providing me with a great coach and environment that nourished a love of sport and community. I used to say that "everyone should run" but now I like to say that "everyone should run for a reason".

Having a supportive family, spouse, and community makes any journey that much greater and sweeter. I certainly would not be the runner or person I am today with the support of those around me. Kay Anne resides in Canton, Georgia with her husband and three daughters, RaeAnna(19), Charlotte (18), and Stella (15).


