|   | Complete the CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE®: PROFILE is an online application used by  |
|   | certain colleges and scholarship programs to determine eligibility for their aid dollars. Complete   |
|   | with your parents.   |
|   | Prepare early decision/early action or rolling admission applications as soon as possible.   |
|   | Colleges may require test scores and applications between Nov. 1 and Nov. 15 for early   |
|   | decision admission.  |
|   | Ask a counselor or teacher for recommendations if you need them.   |
|   | ☐ Request these in Naviance Student  |
|   | <ul> <li>Ensure your Resume, Student Accomplishment Sheet, and Parent Recommendation</li> </ul>  |
|   | Forms are updated.   |
|   | Write first drafts and ask teachers and others to read them if you're submitting essays. If  |
|   | you're applying for early decision, finish the essays for that application now.  |
|   | Complete at least one college application by October 1.  |
|   | Ask your school counselor to send your transcripts to colleges through Naviance Student.   |
|   | Please allow one school week for processing.   |
|   | Visit with your school counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate and fulfill college   |

|   | Keep working hard all year; second semester grades can affect scholarship eligibility.   |

| <b>Research</b> and identify if you qualify for scholarships at each college you have applied to. |  |  |

| Keep active in school. If you are waitlisted, the college will want to know what you have         |  |  |
| accomplished between the time you applied and the time you learned of its decision.               |  |  |
| Visit your final college before accepting. You should receive acceptance letters and              |  |  |
| financial aid offers by mid-April. Notify your counselor of your choice. If you have questions    |  |  |
| about housing offers, talk to your counselor or call the college.                                 |  |  |
| Inform every college of your acceptance or rejection of the offer of admission and/or financial   |  |  |
| aid by May 1. Colleges cannot require your deposit or your commitment to attend before May        |  |  |
| Talk to your counselor or adviser if you have questions.  |  |  |
| Send your deposit to one college only.  |  |  |
| Take any AP® Exams. Show what you've learned in your AP classes. A successful score               |  |  |
| could even earn you credit, advanced placement, or both in college.                               |  |  |
| Waitlisted by a college? If you intend to enroll if you are accepted, tell the admission director |  |  |
| your intent and ask how to strengthen your application. Need financial aid? Ask whether funds     |  |  |
| will be available if you're accepted.   |  |  |
| Work with the college admissions office to resolve any admission or financial aid problems.       |  |  |
| Ask your high school to send a final transcript to your college through Family                    |  |  |
| Connection/Naviance.  |  |  |
| Review your financial aid awards: Not all financial aid awards are the same, so it's important    |  |  |
| to choose the aid package that's best for you and your family. Be sure to note what you have to   |  |  |
| do to continue receiving financial aid from year to year, and how your aid might change in        |  |  |

| Watch the mail for your Student Aid Report (SAR)—it should arrive four weeks after the            |  |  |
| FAFSA is filed.   |  |  |
| Ask your school counseling office in January to send first semester transcripts to schools.       |  |  |
| where you applied if they are required. In May, they will need to send final transcripts to the   |  |  |

| <b>Keep</b> track of and observe deadlines for sending in all required fees and paperwork.        |  |  |
| Continue to look for scholarship opportunities.   |  |  |
