Talking about good management, this evening we will be voting on the Single Audit Report prepared for the District by our CPA firm, Maher Duessel. I understand that it was a wonderful event and is a real testament to the Foster community both past and present that so many people attended to celebrate this special milestone in the school's history.

Let me also take a moment to give a special "shout out" to our Girls Tennis Team. I do so not only because of their Section Championship and WPIAL runner-up finish but, even more so, because these accomplishments were achieved without the benefit of playing any home matches. Instead, and as the Board will recall, the Tennis Team has in fact had to play all of their "home" matches at a neighboring school during the entire construction process. We really had hoped to enable the girls to at least play one match on Horsman Drive but, unfortunately, it did not work out. Despite this fact, the girls have had a great season and will hopefully continue this success into the PIAAL Playoffs. Congratulations to all of the members of the team and Coach Skrok.

Last but certainly not least, tonight we bring back the "Extra Mile Award" which (as its name reflects) recognizes a District employee who does indeed "go the extra mile" for our students.
