- Explore opportunities for increased after school student interventions at school sites (ie. high school/college tutors)
- Continue to provide enrichment opportunities for students (ie. Summer, STEAM, VAPA, Coding)

SAFETY

- Explore opportunities for Restorative Justice at more school sites (ie. parent training)
- 2. Review and revisit positive behavior support systems at school sites
- Maximize intern and counseling support at school sites

SCHOOL CONNECTEDNESS

- . Providing intentional professional development for parents --more mini parent university throughout the year
- Revisit the role of the community liaison to build capacity for meaningful parent engagement.
- Expand interpretation options for school sites (ie. Vietnamese and other languages)
