Through the **Kindness in Motion** program offered through NWR7, we applied for a grant that was accepted to help the family.

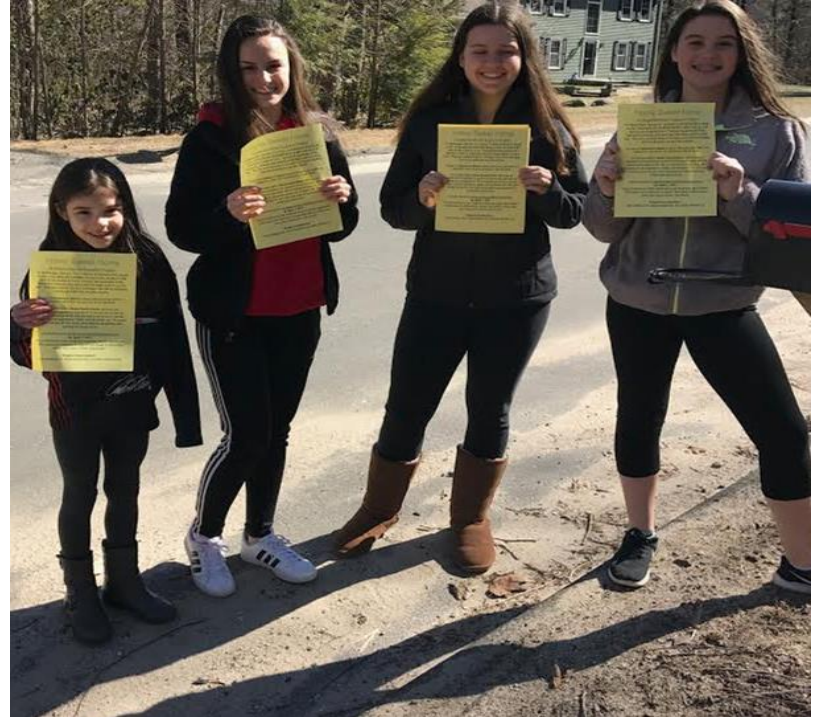
