Exam season is here!

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a short and very busy half term. Exams for students in Years 11 and 13 are now well underway and today we formally said goodbye to our Year 13 students. Over the break it is important that all these students complete plenty of revision for the exams they will have across the two weeks after half term.

On Wednesday we were very honoured to host a visit from Baroness Lawrence, mother of Stephen Lawrence who was killed in London in 1993 in a racially motivated attack. She spoke with students and toured the school. Some students had the opportunity to talk to her about her work including what she does in the House of Lords. Students wore orange ribbons as a mark of respect (it was Stephen's favourite colour) and we will mark National Stephen Lawrence Day on 22 April each year as a school. This encourages everyone to *live their best life*.

Our school day returns to normal after half term with lessons finishing at 2.50pm once again. We know that Eid will take place at some point in the week after half term and remind students this will be normal school day for those not celebrating Eid.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE MATTERS

School starts at 8.30am daily

Our end of year **attendance target** is for every student to reach a **minimum of 96%** attendance. Therefore, to help support this please adhere to the following;

Registration: All students **MUST** arrive by **8.30am**.

Punctuality: Any student that arrives in school after 8.30am is marked late and advised accordingly of sanctions in place. If lateness persists, parents/carers will be contacted to discuss this matter further. If no improvement is made then the Attendance Service at Slough Borough Council may issue a Warning/Penalty Notice.

Absence: If a student is absent from school due to illness or has a medical appointment, we will require a parent/ carer to contact the school by telephoning the absence line on 01753 486047 ext. 285 by **9.30 am** or emailing: attendance@slougheton.com. On the student's return to school he/she must **bring a signed note with the explanation** of the absence and/or medical evidence.

Appointments: There has been an increased number of appointments this half term. We know sometimes it is difficult to control some appointments, however, if possible please make appointments after school, towards the end of the day, or during the school holidays to minimise absence.

If a student has a medical/dental appointment during the school day, we **must** see proof of this appointment. For safeguarding reasons, students from Years 7 to 11 must be collected by their parent/carers from the school reception as **no** student will be allowed to leave the school site unaccompanied.

Leave of Absence Request: Forms are available from the school, however, **no** holiday will be authorised unless for **exceptional circumstances** in which case evidence may be requested. Unauthorised absence may incur a penalty notice.

During Ramadan students' fasting should not affect attendance or punctuality. We have been accommodating by changing the school day. We also understand that some students are attending the First Aid room due to fatigue, thirst or hunger. Please can we remind our students that the First Aid room is for medical emergencies, taking medication or injury only.

Those of you who are fasting should think about bringing in something to do at lunchtime so you do not get bored. There are plenty of places where you can sit and play games (such as cards).

PE lessons during Ramadan

During the month of Ramadan we have altered our PE curriculum to ensure all students who are fasting will not be exerting maximum levels of participation; therefore all students are still expected to participate in their PE lessons as normal. Please ensure your child is organised with their PE kit as normal.



Uniform Guidance

We expect all students to maintain a high standard of appearance. Full school uniform should be worn at all times. Jewellery is not permitted except for a wristwatch, and one pair of plain studs or sleepers in ears. No nail varnish or makeup is allowed. Loan uniform is available from the Community Outreach Office.

Hair - Haircuts must be neat and tidy. Minimum cut length to the top and sides is a number 2.

Low skin fades as are acceptable, provided the style is not extreme in any way (with no lines, patterns, the vast majority of the hair being at least number 2 in length, and no areas of apparent baldness).

Student Drop off

Please could we ask that you consider how you drop your children off in the morning, please do not use the end of the driveway or the disabled bays in the car park, this causes huge congestion.

Year 11 Slough Schools Cup Semi Final

Windsor Boys' 4 - 2 Slough and Eton

This was a last game for the school to remember for Slough and Eton's Year 11. Having lost 7-0 to Windsor in the league earlier in the season, we took the lead with our first chance of the match - a delicate finish from Atif giving us an unexpected lead. Windsor equalised soon after from a corner and led just before half time after defensive lapses crept in.

After half time, outstanding work from Haris - easily the most dangerous player on the pitch for either side - took him from an unthreatening position past 2 or 3 defenders to the edge of the 6 yard box where he squared for Atif's second of the game. After this, determination and organisation improved in defence and Windsor were kept out until their midfield took control and took the lead with 10 minutes to go. Needing a goal, we committed to attacking and Windsor were able to secure the win on the break two minutes from time.

Year 7 Cricket -Division 1

Slough and Eton (91-3) bt St. Bernard's (40 all out) by 51 runs

Batting first, Slough and Eton made 91 for the loss of only 3 wickets in their first game for the school against a traditionally strong St. Bernard's team. Haseeb top scored for Slough and Eton, aided by Ayan as opener.

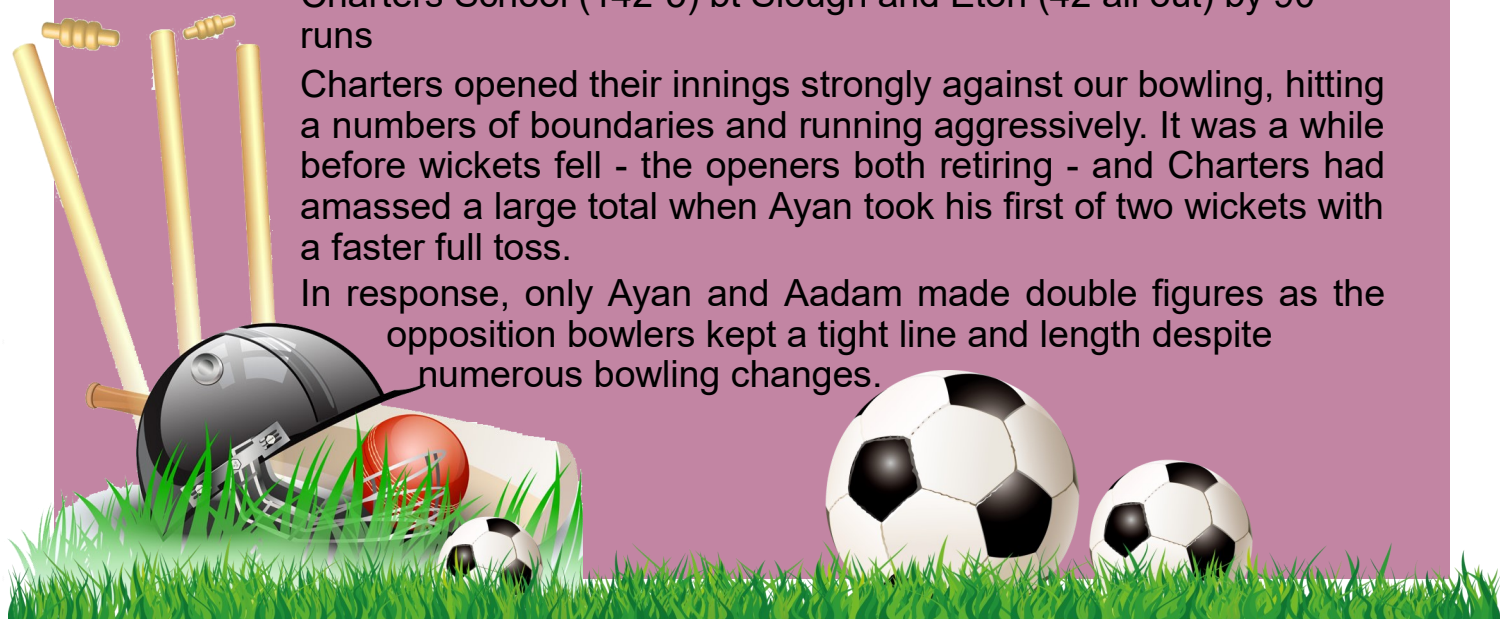
In response, St. Bernard's lost early wickets as Jawad and Haseeb removed both openers in their first over each. Aadam and Ayan replaced as first change and took wickets of their own, before excellent economy from Huzaifa and Rehan meant that St. Bernard's never looked within sight of chasing 92. With the tailenders dismissed, Slough and Eton recorded their first victory in their first game.

County Cup

Charters School (142-5) bt Slough and Eton (42 all out) by 90 runs

Charters opened their innings strongly against our bowling, hitting a numbers of boundaries and running aggressively. It was a while before wickets fell - the openers both retiring - and Charters had amassed a large total when Ayan took his first of two wickets with a faster full toss.

In response, only Ayan and Aadam made double figures as the opposition bowlers kept a tight line and length despite numerous bowling changes.

STEAM Festival 2019



On Wednesday 15th May, 20 Year 8 students attended Surrey University's STEAM festival. This one-off event was a showcase and celebration of different subject disciplines and their application within Higher Education and Industry, with a particular focus on Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics. Students discovered how science, mathematics and the arts can collaborate through technology and innovation, and saw how everyday objects are created from a different perspective. The students observed the subjects in a different light and learnt more about potential career options and pathways in the process. The exhibit included practical engineering challenges, planetarium shows, theatre and dance performances and careers zone with learning library. Students who attended the McLaren presentation were shocked to hear about the 0 - 60 mph time and that the maximum speed of car is over 200 mph! Our students took a lot of interest in the car and impressed the presenters with their questions.

Interview Techniques which raises awareness of what is appropriate during an interview, what an

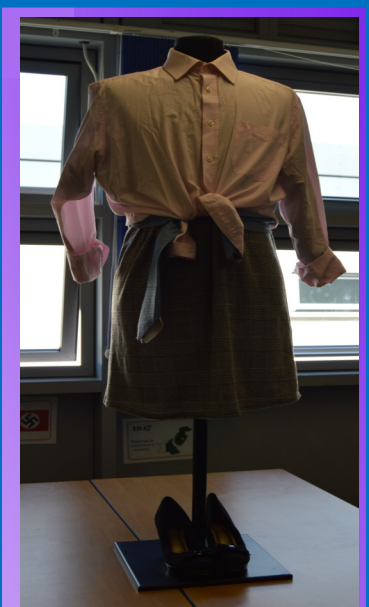
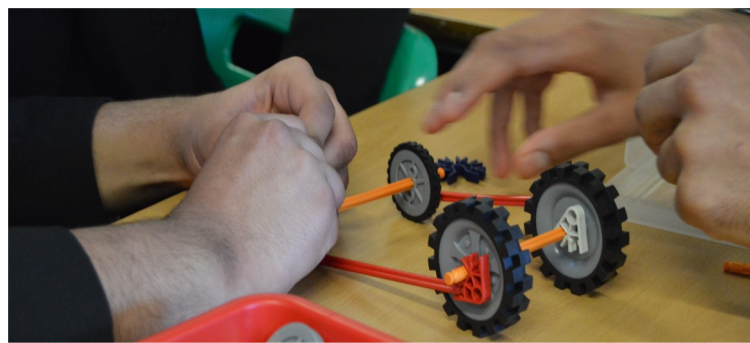
employer may be expecting and the chance to practise or observe an interview.

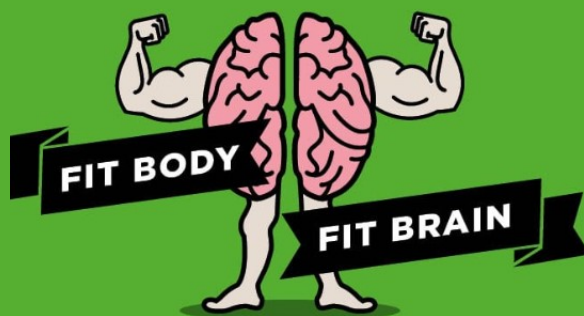

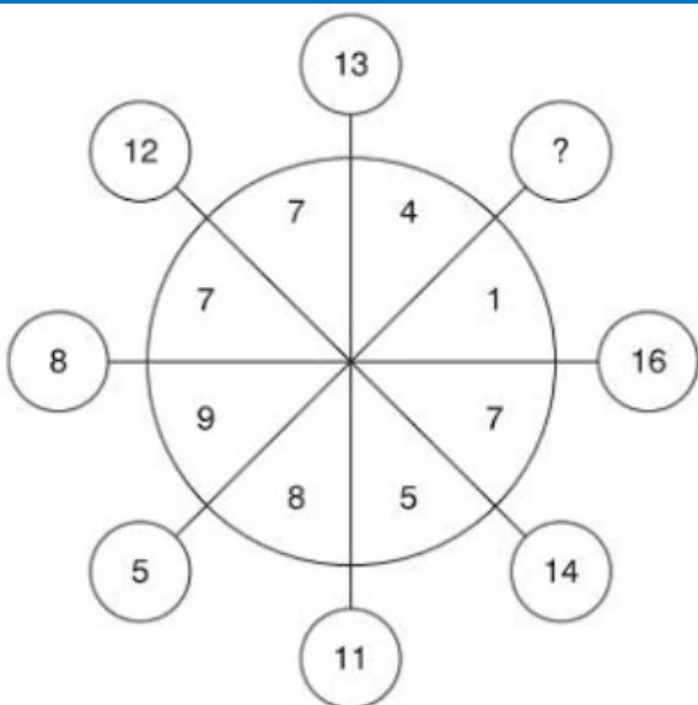
